Conversion: The Miraculous Work of God

Sinners are saved by grace alone through faith alone in Christ alone, and yet salvation is not merely mental assent or a matter of human effort, but the result of God's miraculous work in a person's heart and mind that results in real and radical change.

- 3. How do these verses clarify that a person cannot earn their salvation?

B. Read Ezekiel 36:22-27

- 1. How are people described before salvation?
- 2. How is the miraculous work of God described in verses 24-27 and what is the result?
- 3. What illustration is given in Ezekiel 37? How is life given to the dry bones?

C. Read John 3:1-15

- 1. What is the context for Jesus' comments on the miraculous nature of saving faith?
- 2. According to Jesus, what needs to happen to a person? How does this event happen?

II. The Pictures of a Miraculous Work of God

- A. List three of Jesus' miracles and describe how they point to the miracle of salvation.
- B. As you think of the miracles, how radical was the change and how did the people respond?
- C. In what ways do you need the on-going miraculous work of God in your life?

III. The Promise to be Miracle Workers for God

A. Read John 14:1-14

- 1. How is the message of salvation being taught to the disciples in these verses?
- 2. What are the works that Jesus did? According to Jesus, who will do them also?
- 3. What does Jesus mean when He says, "and greater works than these he will do"?

B. Application Questions

- 2. What are some things that you can do to address those issues?
