III. Beauty of a Supernatural Community – Read 1 John 4:7-11 and Romans 14:1-23

 - 1. How do we know what love is? How would you describe that love in your own words?
 - 2. What is the connection between loving God and loving your brother or sister in Christ?
 - 3. What are some practical steps that you can take to grow in loving people in our church?

B. Read Romans 14:1-23 and Romans 15:5-7

- 1. How would you describe the issue that is taking place in the church at Rome?
- 2. According to Romans 14:4 and 15:7, why should we not judge fellow believers?
- 3. By implication, why is it wrong to impose your preferences on other people?
- 4. What convictions do you have that are personal preferences and not gospel essentials?
