Sermon Theme – Believers are more than conquerors through faith in their crucified and risen Savior, Jesus Christ, the Son of Man (Daniel 7), who ushers in God's kingdom with power and authority, which He secured through His death, burial, and resurrection as the Suffering Servant (Isaiah 53) and is ultimately given to the saints of the Most High.

- D. Read Isaiah 53:1-12. Where do you see the theme of Jesus being the Suffering Servant in Mark?
- E. How do the confessions of Peter (8:27-30), Bartimaeus (10:46-52) and the centurion (15:39) help you understand who Jesus is? How do these confessions help you understand Mark's structure?
- F. How is the resurrection (16:1-8) the greatest confirmation that Jesus is the promised Messiah?

III. Application Questions

- A. How does Mark help you understand who Jesus is and what He came to accomplish?
- B. How does Jesus being the Son of Man encourage you regarding the coming Kingdom of God?
- C. How does Jesus' willingness to suffer as the Son of Man motivate you to serve others?
