

THE FAITHFUL LAMB

(03/22/2026; Luke 22:1-62; Richie Pendred; Christ Proclamation Church)

Sermon Theme: Jesus is the true Passover Lamb who faithfully submits to the Father's will amid betrayal, distress, and negligent disciples. He deals with our sin and obeys the Father where we fail. So, Christians take comfort: Jesus knows the depths of our sinfulness, yet faithfully saves us and keeps us forever!

I. Passover Fulfilled – Read Luke 22:1-38

- A. Read Luke 22:1-6. What stands out to you about Judas' planned betrayal?
- B. What does Jesus mean when He says, "He will not eat it until it's fulfilled in the kingdom of God"? What is the significance of these words?
- C. Read Exodus 12:26-27, 43-51. What are some of the similarities and differences between the institution of the Passover Meal and the Lord's Supper?
- D. How does the Lord's Supper impact your view of the importance of the local church and the gathering of the saints on Sunday morning for corporate worship? How would you like to grow in understanding of the beauty and significance of the family meal?

II. Faithfulness Displayed – Read Luke 22:39-62

- A. What observations do you make about Jesus' faithfulness amid distress, betrayal, and denial?
- B. Read Luke 22:39-46. What is the cup that Jesus asks the Father to remove from Him? How does Jesus' submission to the will of God demonstrate His perfect obedience?
- C. Satan's name is referenced twice in this passage. Why does Satan enter Judas, but not Peter? How is it an encouragement to you that Jesus intercedes for those that He loves?

III. Salvation Secured – Application

- A. Read Romans 5:6-10. How does Paul describe our spiritual condition before Christ? How did Jesus save us? What did He save us from?
- B. In what ways is it encouraging that Jesus knows you, willingly saves you, and promises to keep you forever?
- C. Read Hebrews 9:11-15. What do we learn about the New Covenant from this passage? How does Jesus secure the hope of eternal life for His people?
- D. How should the gospel of Jesus Christ stir comfort, awe, and worship in our hearts? How can we cultivate awe for God when we are burdened by sin, trials, or life's trials?
