- Q. May one who doubts of his being in Christ, or of his due preparation, come to the Lord's Supper?
- A. Such a man may have true interest in Christ, though he is not yet assured of it; and in God's account has it, if he is duly affected with the apprehension of the lack of it, and genuinely desires to be found in Christ, and to depart from iniquity: in that case (because promises are made, and this sacrament is appointed, for the relief even of weak and doubting Christians) he is to lament his unbelief, and labor to have his doubts resolved; and, so doing, he may and ought to come to the Lord's Supper, that he may be further strengthened.
