EMPHASIS FOR THE MONTH: Laying a Foundation & Building Relational Capital

SERMON DISCUSSION TIME: Have someone read this week's scripture from Luke 5:1-11, and then this sermon summary to jog everyone's memory:

In this sermon, Pastor Mike unveils a profound truth about discipleship through the lens of Peter's transformative encounter with Jesus. What begins as a seemingly ordinary fishing lesson becomes a divine intersection of holiness and grace that forever changes Peter's life. Through the miraculous catch of fish, Peter confronts the terrifying reality of God's holiness, falling at Jesus' feet in recognition of his own sinfulness. Yet instead of destruction, he encounters Christ's unexpected grace -- "Do not be afraid." This powerful collision of divine holiness and mercy at the cross becomes the catalyst for Peter's total surrender, compelling him to leave everything and follow Jesus as a "fisher of men." Pastor Mike challenges believers to experience this same radical transformation, warning that encountering only God's holiness leads to fear, while experiencing only grace creates cheap sentimentalism. He urgently

calls the church to "let down their nets," sharing the life-changing gospel before the age of grace ends, reminding us that our lives are meant to be extensions of Jesus' invitation into God's kingdom.

QUESTION #1 - Reflect on a time when you felt the holiness of God in your life. How did it impact your understanding of your own sinfulness?

QUESTION #2 - The sermon mentioned that perfect love casts out fear. How have you experienced this in your own life?

QUESTION #3 - The sermon emphasized the urgency of sharing the gospel because the age of grace will not last forever. How does this urgency affect your perspective on evangelism?

QUESTION #4 - How has your understanding of the intersection of holiness and grace transformed your life? Share a personal story if you feel comfortable.

PRAY TOGETHER: Spend time taking *and recording* prayer requests and then pray together as a group (*I strongly encourage you to send out the prayer requests weekly to your group to keep everyone informed and in the loop on how to pray for one another throughout the week. This also makes it easier to check-in with people who have shared requests to see how the Lord has been working in their lives).*
