## **Study Questions**

## The Mighty in the Lord, Pt 2 2 Samuel 23:20-23

- 1) **READ** 2 Samuel 23:20-23. Do you agree with the statement, "You are great because God has made you great?" Explain your answer. A Biblical way of answering this would be to refer to Scripture: Genesis 1:26-27 and Ephesians 1:3-23.
  - What has the Lord imparted to all people and then specifically to believers only?
  - What made Benaiah mighty?
  - What responsibilities were assigned to him (2 Sa 23:23b; 2 Sa 8:18; 1 Chr 27:5; 1 Ki 1:32; 1 Ki 2:46; 1 Ki 4:4)?
  - Returning to 1 Sa 23:20-23, what adjectives are used to describe Benaiah?
- 2) **READ** James 2:26. What is the difference between faith and works? How do faith and works complement one another? (cf. James 2:18-26) How, specifically, does your faith and work complement one another? [What are your works and are they a reflection of your faith?]
- 3) Carefully **READ** again 2 Samuel 23:20-23. There are three columns below. Give the colored portions a title after first making observations about the Scripture provided. Use another page if desired.

- 7) Benaiah found himself in three extraordinary situations. What were they? In the message it was mentioned that we should "be proactive and face our fears head on." How was Benaiah proactive to face his challenges? What challenges do you need to face head on? What has prevented you from facing those challenges? What's stopping you today?
