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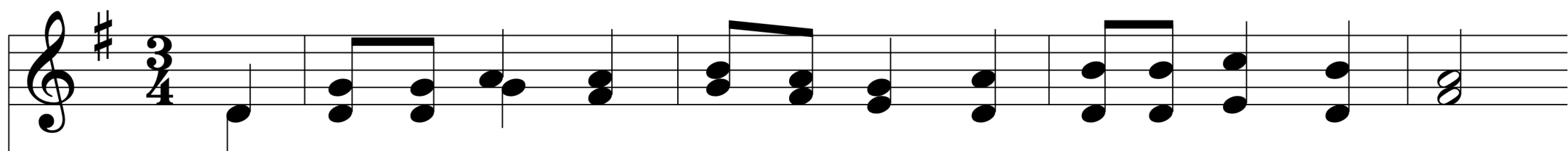

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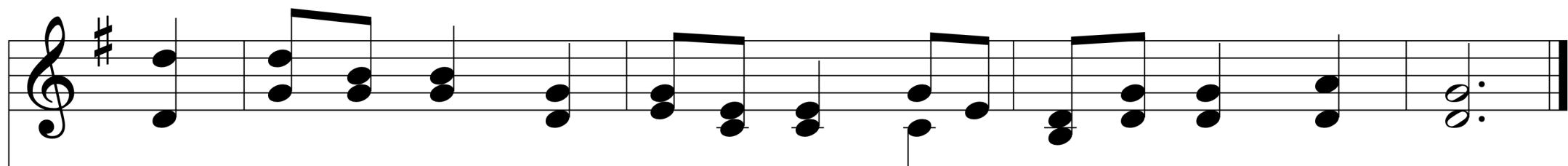
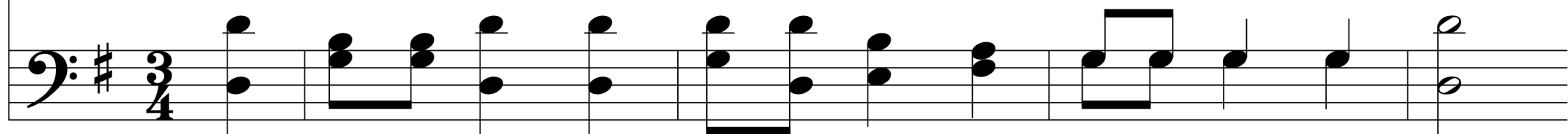

O, For a Thousand Tongues to Sing

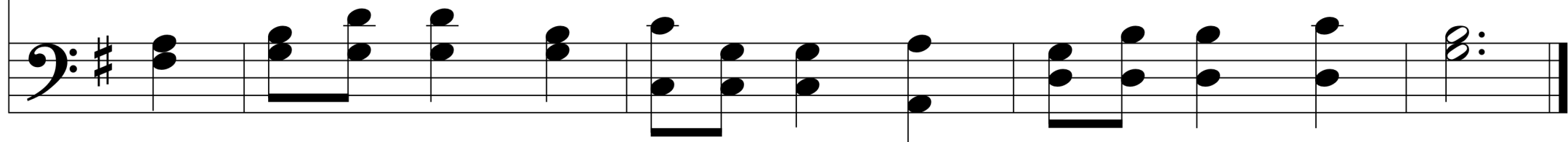
My tongue shall declare Your righteousness and Your praise all day long. Psalm 35:28

All must work for good to me.

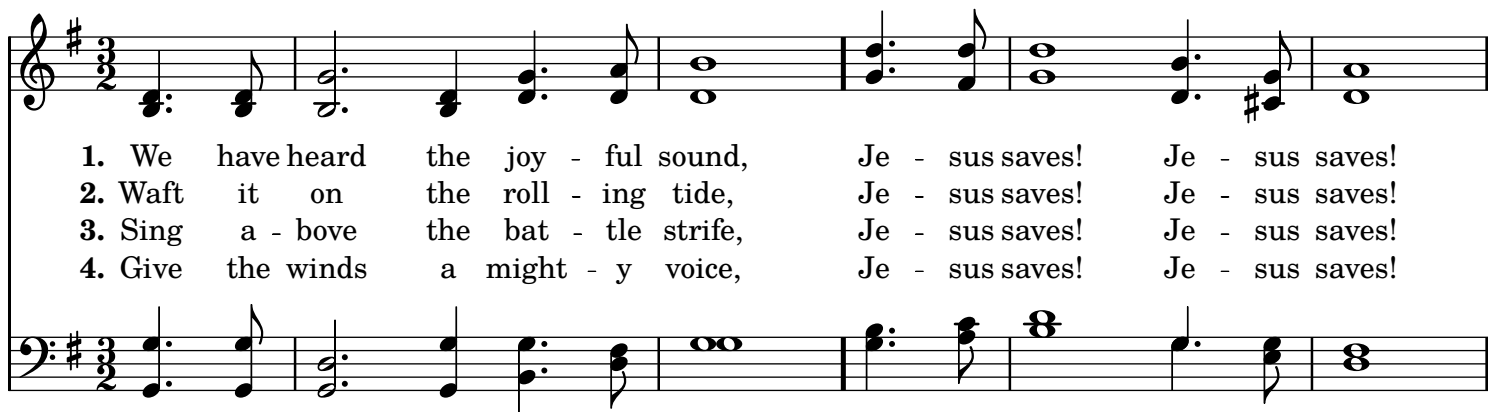
5. Soul, then know thy full salvation

Faith to sight, and prayer to praise.

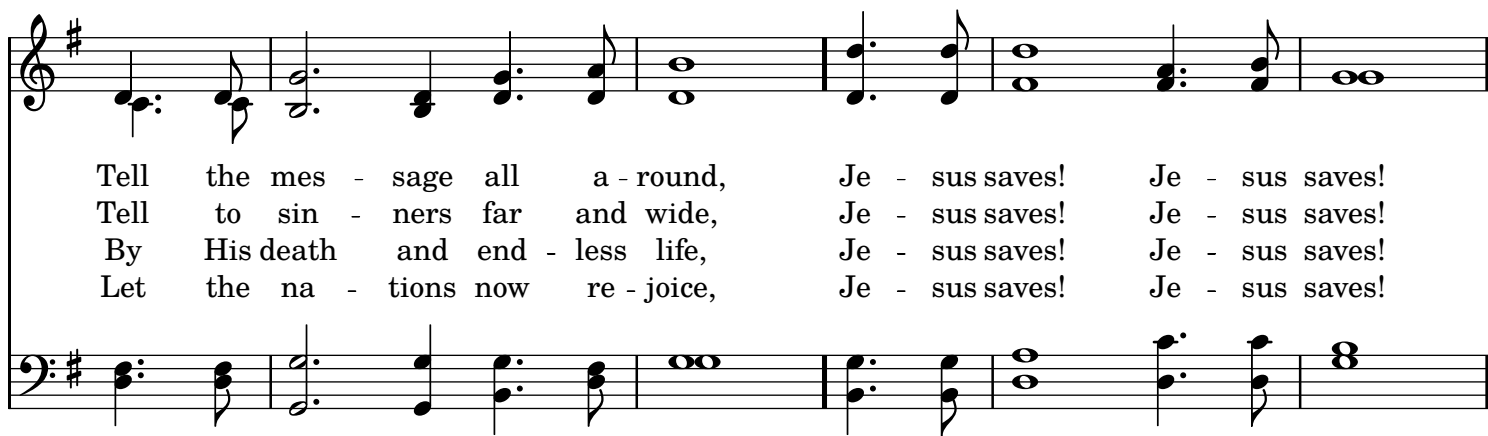
