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


Israel rejects God's provisions • Numbers 11:1-12:16







The Priests God Appointed

God appointed certain people to be priests in the tabernacle. Circle those dressed like priests.





In Numbers 16:1–17:11, God defended Aaron's authority to serve as high priest. Today, the only High Priest is Jesus, who continues as high priest forever (Heb 7:24). He alone is able to save all those who draw near to God through Him (7:25).

Korah perverted God's word like all false teachers do (Jude 4–11). Therefore, God was just in judging him. Yet in the sons of Korah we also see God's grace (Num 26:11). 

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

Connect the dots to see what God told Moses to build.








