Confession of Sin Adapted from John Calvin's 'Form of Church Prayers'

Minister: Let us confess our sins together.

All: Lord God! Heirs of God, joint-heirs with Jesus Long ere time its race begun To His name eternal praises O what wonders love has done! One with Jesus By eternal union one


