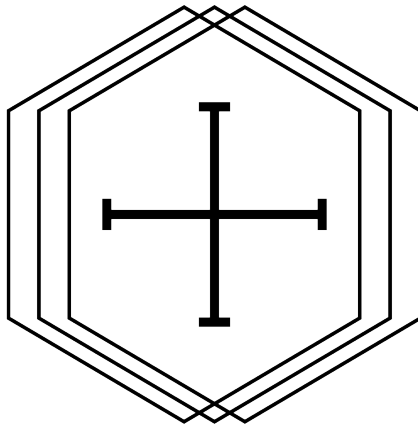

Heidelberg Catechism Q&A 1

Minister: What is your only comfort in life and in death?

All: That I am not my own, but belong—body and soul, in life and in death—to my faithful Savior, Jesus Christ. He also watches over me in such a way that not a hair can fall from my head without the will of my Father in heaven; in fact, all things must work together for my salvation. Because I belong to him, Christ, by his Holy Spirit, assures me of eternal life and makes me wholeheartedly willing and ready from now on to live for him.

Call to Confession

Psalm 139:23-24

Confession of Sin

Minister: Let us confess our sins together.

All: O Lord, no day of our life has passed that has not proved us guilty in your sight. Prayers have been uttered from a prayerless heart; praise has been often praiseless sound; our best services are filthy rags. Blessed Jesus, let us find a refuge in your healing wounds.

Keep us always clinging to your cross, flood us every moment with amazing grace. In your merciful name we pray. Amen.

Goes forth with joy his race to run

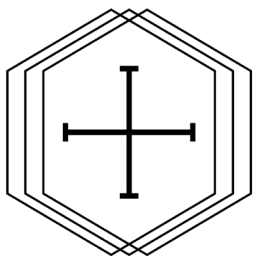
The perfect law of God will make the soul revive

In keeping them is great reward

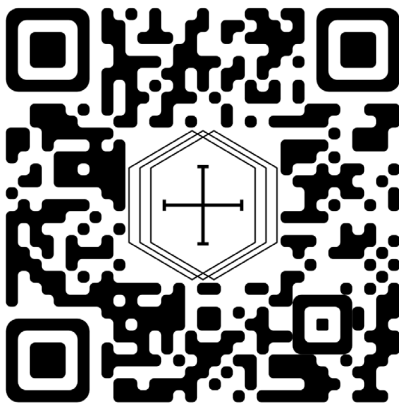
So let the words I speak be pleasing in your sight
