Affirmation of Faith

Philippians 2:6-11

Minister: What do the Scriptures teach about the Lord Jesus Christ?

taking the form of a servant, being born in the likeness of men. And being found in human form, he humbled himself by becoming obedient to the point of death, even death on a cross. Call to Confession Matthew 22:36-40


