Introduction:

4 Major prophets (Major regarding length)

12 Minor prophets

All written between 760 and 460 B.C.

The Nature of Prophecy:

A. Misunderstanding: "Foretelling or prediction" Reality: Less than 2 % of OT prophecy

- B. Prophets as "covenant executers"
 - Spokespersons who Speak for God

Formula: "And the word of the Lord came upon..."

- Covenant enforcers who proclaimed the covenant blessing and curses to Isreal.

The prophets message was not their own, but God's (Exod. 3:1; Isa. 6; Jer. 1; Hos.1:2,; Amos 7:12-15)

I.e. They didn't invent curses, blessing or message, but came from Mosaic Covenant, see especially Deut.

Formula: 1:3

Explanation: 2:7; 3:1-11

Illustration: 20:27-39 compared to Dt. 12:1-10, 13; Dt. 28)

C. Prophets were Preachers!

Text: God's Covenant as revealed to Moses

Message: Repentance and Faith in God's covenant provisions.

Interpreting the Prophets

A. Historical Context:

Prophets lived in period which called especially for covenant enforcement mediation.

God leaving a "paper trail" of His warnings before judgment

God preparing for the salvation through the Messiah.

Political and Social History inter-weaved with religious history

B. Literary Forms:

Examples: Types of prophetic oracles

1. Covenant Lawsuit (Is. 3:13-26; Hos. 3:3-17, etc.)

Court convenes: (13-14)
Indictment: (14b-16)

3. Evidence: context

4. Judgment sentence: (17-26)

2. Woe oracle: A cry of "grief" when facing disaster or death like at a funeral. Example Habakkuk 2:6-8; Micah 2:1-5; Zeph. 2:5-7

- 1. Announcement of distress
- 2. Reason fro distress
- 3. Prediction of doom.
- 3. Promise Oracle: or "salvation oracle"

Example: Amos 9:11-15

- 1. Future mentioned "in that day"
- 2. Restoration described as a radical change
- 3. Blessing in covenantal categories (see redemptive historical chart)

I.e. Temporal covenant = temporal categories = prefiguring

spiritual blessing in Christ

C. Two Level Meanings: Present covenant and New covenant
