Some Additional Family Worship Resources

Superbook: This is an animated series with each episode being a story from the Bible. Most of the dialogue the Bible characters speak is from Scripture itself. These episodes can be a nice evening supplement when an episode represents a portion of Scripture you recently read during family worship. (Available on its web site, Amazon Prime, and YouTube.)

Full of Eyes: This is a collection of beautifully animated videos designed to represent different Biblical themes or theological concepts. Think "theologically rich moving stained-glass windows." Each video is set to tasteful music and meaningful for adults as well as children. The moving artwork is created by Christopher Powers, pastor of Kingstree Church. (Available on the Full of Eyes web site and YouTube.)

The Greatest Adventure, Stories from the Bible: While this animated series is from the 1980s and takes some liberties with storylines, it is still a fun and clean supplement to the reading of a Bible story that one of its episodes corresponds to. Its animation style will be familiar to anyone who watched 1980s cartoons, but also provides for a rich viewing experience to new audiences. (Available for purchase on Amazon and free with ads on YouTube.) The Complete Book of When and Where: In the Bible and Throughout History (by E. Michael and Sharon Rusten): This is a good book to read to your children about church history, a topic most of us aren't as comfortable with as we'd like! It chronologically describes major events in Christian history from Bible times all the way through to the twenty-first century. I'll often read an entry at dinner time and call it "family history." Some of my kids' new heroes, like Gregory the Illuminator who brought Christianity to Armenia in the 300s and helped it to become the first Christian nation, came from reading this book. Reawaken Hymns: Reawaken Hymns is a musical project that takes the words and tunes of classic Christian hymns and sets them to some contemporary instrumentation. (Available on YouTube and Spotify.)
