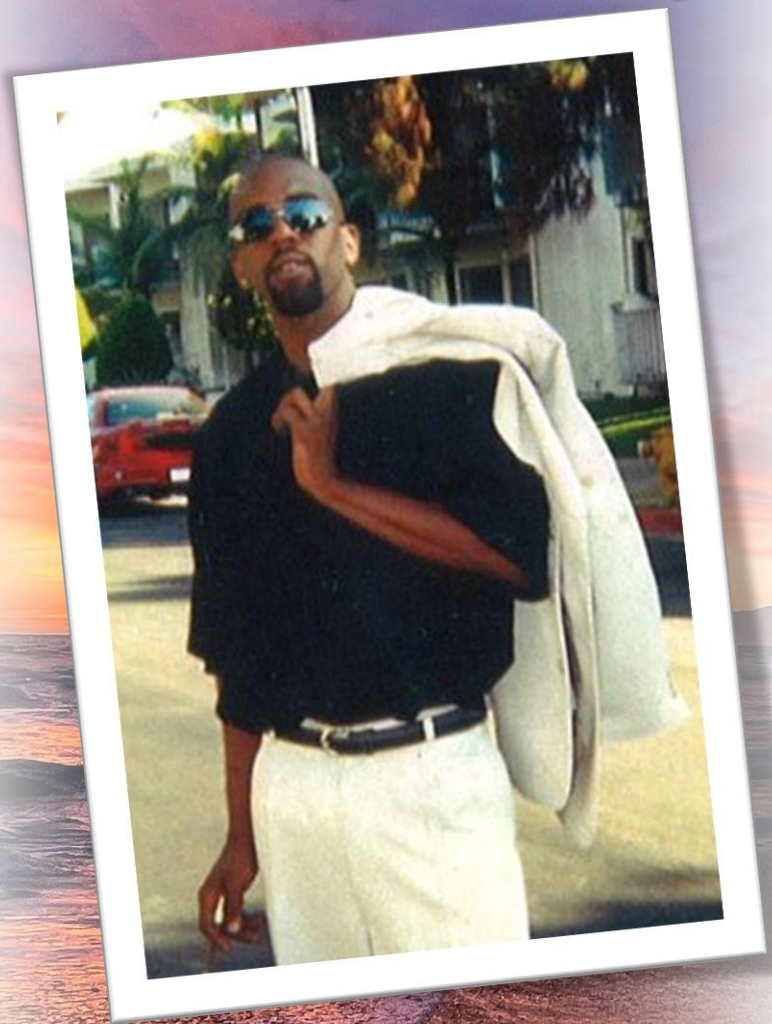

Jeremy Peterson

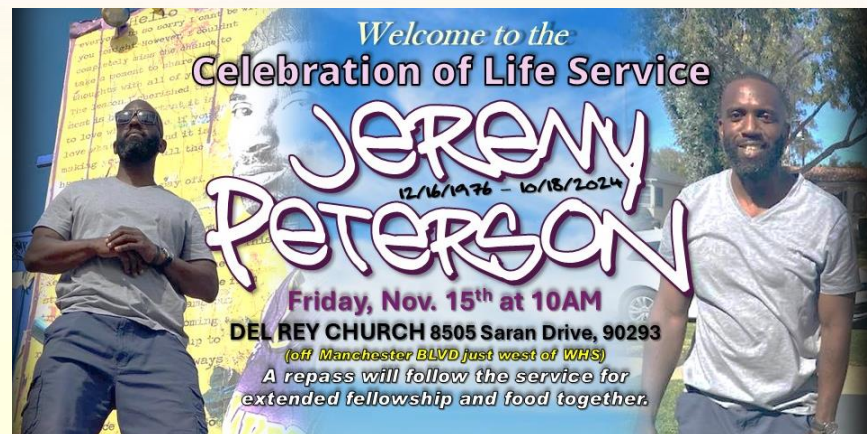
