

What does antiphon or antiphonal mean?

What does the Hebrew word "chesed" mean?

Where in the Bible do we read about the Abrahamic Covenant? What's it about?

Many scholars see the images of Psalm 118 being a part of the history of the post-exile of Israel. Why is this era called the post-exile? What special things happened in it?

The Jewish people had something they called the "Shalosh Regalim" (שלוש רגלים). What did Pastor Matt say that was and why it was important to our study of Psalm 118 and Palm Sunday?

In the sermon, we heard about the Feast of Tabernacles (also known as the feast/festival of booths or tents and in Hebrew it was called "sukkot"). What was this holiday about and how did Jewish people celebrate it?

How does Palm Sunday relate to the Feast of the Tabernacles and Psalm 118?

Why do we call it "Palm Sunday"?

What was the parable in Mark's gospel that Pastor Matt spoke about and why did it matter?

How did Mark's gospel use Psalm 118 in telling us about Jesus?

In the sermon, Pastor Matt spoke about God being three persons. What does that mean?

Who is Jesus?

In the sermon, Pastor Matt spoke about "the gospel of Jesus." What is that about?

At the end of the sermon, Pastor Matt led us in taking communion. What is that about?

Application Questions:

In Psalm 118 we read about giving thanks to God. How can you give thanks to God?

In Psalm 118 we read about fear and hard times. When do you feel afraid?

In Psalm 118 we read about trusting God. How can you grow in trusting God?

In Psalm 118:9 we read "It is better to take refuge in the Lord than to trust in princes." Thinking about princes or political leaders, do you see adults today worried about what is happening on the news with politics and stuff?

In 1 Timothy 2:1–2 we read about how we are to pray for princes or kings and earthly leaders in our nation. Look up these verses. What does it say? How can you pray for our nation this week?

Palm Sunday begins holy week for us as Christians. Next Sunday is Easter. Do you have friends who don't know about Easter and Jesus? How can you love them and pray for them?
