WHAT IS GLORIFICATION?

In the Scriptures, the idea of glorification deals with the ultimate perfection of believers. The word "glorification" is not used in the Hebrew Old Testament or the Greek New Testament, but the idea of glorification is conveyed by the Greek verb *doxazo* ("glorify") and the noun *doxa* ("glory") as well as in passages that do not use any word from this root.

John 6 v ³⁷ All that the Father gives Me will come to Me, and the one who comes to Me I will ^[f]by no means cast out. ³⁸ For I have come down from heaven, not to do My own will, but the will of Him who sent Me. ³⁹ This is the will of the Father who sent Me, that of all He has given Me I should lose nothing, but should raise it up at the last day. ⁴⁰ And this is the will of Him who sent Me, that everyone who sees the Son and believes in Him may have everlasting life; and I will raise him up at the last day."



WHAT IS GLORIFICATION?

The word Glorification means the final stage of our salvation, the receiving of our immortal bodies at the resurrection or rapture. We will be changed into His (Jesus) likeness.

1 Corinthians 15 ²² For as in Adam all die, even so in Christ all shall be made alive. ²³ But each one in his own order: Christ the firstfruits, afterward those *who are* Christ's at His coming. ²⁴ Then *comes* the end, when He delivers the kingdom to God the Father, when He puts an end to all rule and all authority and power. ²⁵ For He must reign till He has put all enemies under His feet. ²⁶ The last enemy *that* will be destroyed *is* death. ²⁷ For "He has put all things under His feet." But when He says "all things are put under *Him," it is* evident that He who put all things under Him is excepted. ²⁸ Now when all things are made subject to Him, then the Son Himself will also be subject to Him who put all things under Him, that God may be all in all.



WHO IS GLORIFIED?

God Glorifies those who are in Jesus Christ His Son

Romans 8:30

Moreover, whom He predestined, these He also called; whom He called, these He also justified; and whom He justified, these He also glorified.

Romans 8:17

and if children, then heirs—heirs of God and joint heirs with Christ, if indeed we <u>suffer with *Him*</u>, that we may also be **glorified** together.



HOW ARE WE GLORIFIED?

We are Glorified when we go to meet the Lord and he changes us into His image.

2 Thessalonians 1:10

when He comes, in that Day, to be **glorified** in His saints and to be admired among all those who believe, because our testimony among you was believed.

2 Thessalonians 1:12

that the name of our Lord Jesus Christ may be **glorified** in you, and you in Him, according to the grace of our God and the Lord Jesus Christ.



WHY WE NEED TO BE GLORIFIED.

We need to be Glorified because of our flesh nature is corrupt and needs to be changed into His likeness.

1 Corinthians 15:53

For this corruptible must put on incorruption, and this mortal must put on immortality.

1 Corinthians 15:54

So, when this corruptible body has put on incorruption, and this mortal has put on **immortality**, then shall be brought to pass the saying that is written: "Death is swallowed up in victory."



WHAT DOES GLORIFICATION GOOD LIKE?

Glorification is our hope in Christ, as the final stage of our salvation.

2 Timothy 1:10

but has now been revealed by the appearing of our Savior Jesus Christ, who has abolished death and brought life and immortality to light through the gospel,

Colossians 1:27

To them God willed to make known what are the riches of the glory of this mystery among the Gentiles: which is Christ in you, the **hope** of glory.

Ephesians 1:18

the eyes **of** your understanding being enlightened; that you may know what is the **hope of** His calling, what are the riches **of** the **glory of** His inheritance in the saints,



THE PURPOSE OF GLORIFICATION

The Purpose of Glorification is to prepare us to meet the Lord and spend eternity with Him. We need glorified bodies to be able to stand in His presence.

Philippians3v20-21

²⁰ For our citizenship is in heaven, from which we also eagerly wait for the Savior, the Lord Jesus Christ, ²¹ who will transform our lowly body that it may be conformed to His glorious body, according to the working by which He is able even to subdue all things to Himself.



Romans 6:5

For if we have been united together, in the likeness of His death, certainly we also shall be in the likeness of His resurrection,

1 Corinthians 15:21

For since by man came death, by Man also came the resurrection of the dead.

1 Corinthians 15:42

So also is the **resurrection** of the dead. The body is sown in corruption, it is raised in incorruption.



2 Corinthians 5 For we know that if our earthly [a]house, this tent, is destroyed, we have a building from God, a house not made with hands, eternal in the heavens. ² For in this we groan, earnestly desiring to be clothed with our [b]habitation which is from heaven, ³ if indeed, having been clothed, we shall not be found naked. ⁴ For we who are in this tent groan, being burdened, not because we want to be unclothed, but further clothed, that mortality may be swallowed up by life. ⁵ Now He who has prepared us for this very thing is God, who also has given us the Spirit as ^[c] a guarantee.

⁶ So we are always confident, knowing that while we are at home in the body we are absent from the Lord. ⁷ For we walk by faith, not by sight. ⁸ We are confident, yes, we'll pleased rather to be absent from the body and to be present with the Lord.



Philippians 3:10

that I may know Him and the power of His **resurrection**, and the fellowship of His sufferings, being conformed to His death,

Philippians 3:11

if, by any means, I may attain to the resurrection from the dead.



1 Peter 1v3

Blessed *be* the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who according to His abundant mercy has begotten us again to a living hope through the **resurrection** of Jesus Christ from the dead,

Revelation 20:6

Blessed and holy is he who has part in the first **resurrection**. Over such the second death has no power, but they shall be priests of God and of Christ and shall reign with Him a thousand years.



1 Thessalonians 4 v¹³ But I do not want you to be ignorant, brethren, concerning those who have fallen ^[b]asleep, lest you sorrow as others who have no hope. ¹⁴ For if we believe that Jesus died and rose again, even so God will bring with Him those who ^[c]sleep in Jesus.

¹⁵ For this we say to you by the word of the Lord, that we who are alive *and* remain until the coming of the Lord will by no means precede those who are ^[d]asleep. ¹⁶ For the Lord Himself will descend from heaven with a shout, with the voice of an archangel, and with the trumpet of God. And the dead in Christ will rise first. ¹⁷ Then we who are alive *and* remain shall be caught up together with them in the clouds to meet the Lord in the air. And thus we shall always be with the Lord. ¹⁸ Therefore comfort one another with these words.
