What is Holiness?

Holiness is a state of being set apart for God's purposes. It signifies moral purity, righteousness, and complete devotion to God. The Bible calls us to be holy because God Himself is holy.

Greek and Hebrew Words for Holiness

- Hebrew: *Qodesh* (קֹדֶשׁ) - This word means "set apart," "sacred," or "dedicated to God."
- Greek: *Hagios* (ἅγιος) - This word means "holy," "pure," or "consecrated."

"But as he who called you is holy, you also be holy in all your conduct, since it is written, 'You shall be holy, for I am holy.'" (1 Peter 1:15-16, ESV)

Hebrews 12:10 - "For they disciplined us for a short time as it seemed best to them, but he disciplines us for our good, that we may share his holiness."

1 Peter 1:15-16 - "But as he who called you is holy, you also be holy in all your conduct, since it is written, 'You shall be holy, for I am holy.'"

2 Peter 3:11 - "Since all these things are thus to be dissolved, what sort of people ought you to be in lives of holiness and godliness."
