Monday: The Enduring Faithfulness of God

Scripture Reading:

Exodus 1:7-14

Devotional:

In the opening chapters of Exodus, we encounter the Israelites under severe oppression by the Egyptian Pharaoh. Yet, despite the harsh conditions, the Israelite population continued to grow, a testament to God's enduring promise to Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob. This mirrors the challenges faced by believers today, where circumstances often seem to oppose God's promises. However, it's in these moments that God's faithfulness shines brightest, reminding us that His plans for us are not thwarted by human actions or worldly oppression.

Discussion/Reflection Questions:

Tuesday: The Courage to Obey God Over Man

Scripture Reading:

Exodus 1:15-21

Devotional:

The story of the Hebrew midwives, Shiphrah and Puah, is a striking example of fearless faith and obedience to God over man's edicts. Despite the potential consequences from the Pharaoh, these women chose to fear God more than the most powerful man in Egypt. Their actions not only saved many lives but also demonstrated the power of faithfulness to God's commands over human authority when the two are in conflict.

This narrative challenges us to evaluate our own priorities and allegiances. In a world that often pressures us to conform to ungodly standards and values, the courage of the midwives reminds us of the importance of obeying God rather than men, especially when the commands of authorities stand in direct opposition to God's Word. Their story encourages us to stand firm in our convictions and to act in faith, trusting that God honors those who honor Him.

May we have the courage to stand up for what is right, to protect and defend the innocent, and to be unwavering in our commitment to follow God's commands, even when it means facing opposition. As we do so, we can trust that God is with us, empowering us to make difficult choices and blessing our efforts to serve Him faithfully.

Discussion/Reflection Questions:

1. Have you ever faced a situation where obeying God meant going against human authority? How did you

respond?

2. What does the example of the midwives teach us about the importance of fearing God over man?

Wednesday: God's Provision in Unlikely Circumstances

Scripture Reading:

Exodus 2:1-10

Devotional:

The birth and preservation of Moses is a powerful testimony to God's sovereignty and provision in the most unlikely of circumstances. Moses' mother, faced with the decree that all Hebrew male infants be killed, placed her son in a basket on the Nile, entrusting him to God's care. Discussion/Reflection Questions:

- 1. How does the story of Moses' preservation challenge us to trust God in difficult situations?
- 2. In what ways have you experienced God's provision in your life, especially in circumstances that seemed hopeless?

Prayer:

Heavenly Father, we thank You for Your protective hand and providential care over our lives. Help us to trust You fully, especially in situations that appear hopeless. Guide us to take steps of faith, knowing that You are capable of using any circumstance for Your purposes. Amen.

Thursday: The Power of Growth Amidst Persecution

Scripture Reading:

Acts 8:1-4

Devotional:

The early church faced intense persecution, yet this did not hinder its growth; instead, it catalyzed the spread of the Gospel. The scattering of believers led to the preaching of the Word beyond Jerusalem, fulfilling Jesus' command to be His witnesses "to the ends of the earth." This pattern of growth amidst persecution is a recurring theme in God's kingdom, showing that what is intended to suppress the faith can actually serve to strengthen and expand it.

This historical pattern invites us to reconsider our perspective on trials and opposition. Instead of viewing persecution solely as a hindrance, we can see it as an opportunity for growth and for the furtherance of the Gospel. Discussion/Reflection Questions:

Scripture Reading:
