Dover Devotions:

In our sermon on Sunday, we explored Jacob's transformative encounter with God at Bethel, highlighting the themes of God's boundless love, Jesus as the bridge between heaven and earth, the importance of responding to God's presence, and the reliability of God's unwavering promises. Jacob's experience serves as a powerful reminder that even in our lowest moments, God's grace and faithfulness are accessible, offering hope, reconciliation, and a path to a deeper relationship with God.

Monday - Hope in the Midst of Despair

"And he dreamed, and behold, there was a ladder set up on the earth, and the top of it reached to heaven. And behold, the angels of God were ascending and descending on it!" - Genesis 28:11-12, ESV

Devotional:

Life often brings us to moments of fear, shame, loneliness, and uncertainty, much like Jacob experienced as he fled from his past mistakes. In the midst of his desperation, God reached out to him in a dream, revealing a ladder connecting heaven and earth with angels ascending and descending. Discussion:

Tuesday - The Ladder of God's Redemption

Devotional:

Devotional:

Devotional:

And of all that you give me I will give a full tenth to you." - Genesis 28:20-22 (ESV)

Devotional:

After encountering the living God at Bethel, Jacob's heart was stirred with love and thankfulness. In response to God's promise of protection, provision, and guidance, Jacob voluntarily vowed to follow God like never before. Saturday: Responding to God's Call

"And I heard the voice of the Lord saying, 'Whom shall I send, and who will go for us?' Then I said, 'Here I am! Send me.'" - Isaiah 6:8 (ESV)

Devotional:
