Greetings Friends and Family,

It is my desire that you will use this Advent Calendar to enrich your understanding of Christmas and draw near to our God in anticipation. I created this calendar a few years back when Patrick was deployed in hopes of enriching our future Christmas Seasons together. Advent is derived from the Latin word *adventus* meaning "coming." It is a time we set aside to recognize, anticipate, and prepare our hearts for the coming of Christ. We celebrate both the fulfillment of prophecy in the coming of Christ as Savior and the future fulfillment of Christ's return. It is truly the "magic" of Christmas.

This advent calendar was born out of a desire to streamline our Christmas activities and scripture readings in an effort to be more intentional during the season of Advent. It includes the Old Testament prophecies to give the participant a complete understanding of the miracle of Christ's arrival. The short readings begin with the Law and God's promise to Abraham to set the stage for the need of Christ. The readings progress through the story of Christ's coming to Earth and circle around to end with the fulfillment of the Law through Christ.

Our family took our regular Christmas traditions and incorporated them into each day of the calendar. For example, every year we like to go look at Christmas lights. We placed driving around to look at Christmas lights in our jammies/ star gazing on Day 21 when the Magi followed the star to find Jesus. The activities do not need to align perfectly but we found that incorporating our traditional activities/movies/baking/holiday parties with our readings made Advent a special time for our family. Aligning our family activities with our scripture readings made them come to life. I'll always remember the richness of worshipping in church on Day 15 after reading about the multitude of angels praising God.

Traditionally, Advent begins on the Sunday that falls between November 27th and December 3rd each year. You may also chose to begin Advent on December 1st which will make this calendar end on Christmas Day. I hope you have fun filling in the blanks and personalizing this calendar for your family. You can make a physical calendar in any arrangement you'd like (small garland, bags, envelopes). If you find ways to improve upon this calendar, please email your suggestions so changes can be made for next year's calendar.
