



nēpháleos (an adjective, derived from 3525 /néphō, "to be sober"); properly, not intoxicated, free from negative influences (intoxicants); (figuratively) clear-minded; circumspect ("sober"), free from life-dominating influences.

1. THE MORAL CHARACTER OF A GODLY LEADER



"self-controlled": curbing one's desires and impulses, self-controlled, temperate

kósmios (from 2889 /kósmos, "world";)

– literally, ordered (properly organized); hence, well-prepared (well-ordered).

hospitable; generous to guests; cf. Rom. 12:13; Heb. 13:2; 1 Pet. 4:9

didaktikos: skillful at teaching; cf. 5:17; 2 Tim. 2:24

3 not a drunkard, not violent but gentle, not quarrelsome, not a lover of money.

1. THE MORAL CHARACTER OF A GODLY LEADER

- B does not have a reputation as a drinker: cf. Prov. 20:1; 23:29-35; Is. 28:7; 56:9-12
- gentle: considerate; genial; forbearing; gracious, etc.
- amachos: abstaining from fighting; peaceable; not contentious



aphilárgyros (from 1/A, "not," 5368/philéō, "fond of" and 696/árgyros, "silver") – properly, "not fond of silver," i.e. not covetous for money; free from the love of materialism

cf. 1 Thess. 2:5; 1 Pet. 5:2; Jude 16; Acts 20:33

4 He must manage his own household well, with all dignity keeping his children submissive, 5 for if someone does not know how to manage his own household, how will he care for God's church?
