God "has spoken to us in His Son."

- Not so much that He brought a message from the Father
- He is a message from the Father
- He is far more than the latest or best prophet

God "has spoken to us in His Son."

- In the revelation from Jesus, we see the personality of God.
- In Hebrews, the Father speaks concerning the Son.
 - God the Father is telling us what God the Son is all about.

Hebrews 3-10

- Consider Jesus, Apostle and High Priest
 - Therefore, if you hear His voice, don't harden your heart.
 - Similar to the warning in 2:1-4
 - 3:8, 15; 4:7

- Hold fast our confidence, assurance until the end. 3:6, 14
- Don't be like those in the wilderness who didn't believe and disobeyed.

- Repeated word in Chapters 3, 4
 - Rest
- How do we enter His rest?
 - Faith and belief
 - Unbelievers harden their hearts when they hear His voice

- Rest—through faith and belief
- Hold fast our confession 4:14
- Draw near with confidence
 - Because of Jesus, our high priest 4:15-16; 3:1

- Jesus, our High Priest versus Levitical priesthood
- 4:14-16; 10:19-25, 35-39
- Even though some might shrink back
 - Not listen to His voice or believe
- You hold fast.

 - Warning about continuing in willful sin
 - Leads to judgment

Genesis 1:26

- "Let Us make man in Our image, according to Our likeness."
- God referred to Himself as more than one at creation.

Isa. 6:8; 7:14; 9:6

- When God commissioned Isaiah, He used the plural to refer to Himself
- The virgin birth of son Immanuel
 - Mt. 1:22 23. Jesus fulfilled the prophecy.

Isa. 6:8; 7:14; 9:6

- The Son
- Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God, Eternal Father, Prince of Peace
- The prophets
- God was going to come in the form of a Son.
 - Jesus was that Son—fully God

John 1:1-14

- The Word was with God, and the Word was God. [1]
- He was in the beginning with God.
- The Word became flesh, and dwelt among us.

John 8:24 (compare Ex. 3:14-15); 8:58

- Must believe that I am He.
- Ex. 3: "I AM WHO I AM." His name is YHWH.
- God is YHWH. Jesus is YHWH. They are one.
- Jesus--"before Abraham was born, I am."
 - Refuse to believe this, and you will die in your sins.

John 8:24 (compare Ex. 3:14-15); 8:58

- Hear His voice
- Pay attention
- Don't refuse Him who is speaking

John 10:30-33; 14:9; 20:26-28

Jesus and the Father are one.

He who has seen Me has seen the Father.

Thomas believed when He felt Jesus' glorified body.

Col. 1:15-18

The image of the invisible God The first-born of all creation By Him all things were created All things have been created by Him and for Him He is the beginning, the first-born from the dead

Col. 1:15-18

Compare with Heb. 1:3
The Creator—parallels John 1 and Heb. 1

Phil. 2:5-11

Existed in the form of God

Morphe—shape or nature

Made in the likeness of men

To be obedient to the point of death on the cross

Phil. 2:5-11

God exalted Him
Bestowed on Him the name above every name
That every knee should bow
He is Lord—Master of all

First-born

Born first or preeminent

protos—first; tikto—to bear, bring forth

Meaning?

Since Jesus created all things
Since He has always existed as God
Term cannot refer to His being born into
existence as a created being

First-born son in OT

Son who is to be over the family when the father dies

The one who has preeminence in the family

Jesus, because He became a man, is the firstborn of God.

Yet He is also God Himself

Col. 1:18; Rom. 1:3-4

First-born from the dead

He holds the preeminence of those raised from the dead

God has a Son Page 2.7, Heb. 1.5

First-born

Paul preached to Jews in Antioch Explained Israel's history, history of the gospel Spoke of Jesus' resurrection after the cross

Acts 13:16-39

Quoted Psalm 2

OT Passages: Heb. 1:5; 2 Sam. 7:5-17

Nathan's words to David
About David's son Solomon and his relationship
to God
David wanted to build a temple for God

The Lord told him his son would do it

OT Passages: Heb. 1:5; 2 Sam. 7:5-17

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Context: an eternal kingdom
The descendants of David on earth
A descendant of David on the throne forever
Jesus is also a descendant of King David

Rom. 1:3-4

His throne is forever

Heb. 1:8

OT Passages: Heb. 1:6; Ps. 97:7

Those who worship idols will be ashamed All are to worship the Son "gods" can refer to supernatural powers Heb. 1.6 translates it as "angels of God."

OT Passages: Heb. 1:8-9; Ps. 45:6-7

A song of love directed toward the King

His eternal kingdom of righteousness

Hebrews says this is a reference to the Son of
God, Jesus

Yet another place in OT where God spoke to the fathers about His coming King

OT Passages: Heb. 1:10-12; Ps. 102: 24-27

The psalm is a prayer of the afflicted One afflicted when he is faint and pours out his complaint before the Lord A cry to the Lord for help Contrasts the eternal God with man being limited to days

OT Passages: Heb. 1:10-12; Ps. 102: 24-27

Even the heavens and the earth will perish God will never come to an end The Son is God, the same for all eternity

OT Passages: Heb. 1:13; Ps. 110:1; Acts 2:32-36

David wrote this psalm
God spoke through David, a prophet and king
This is about a kingdom
All enemies of the king will be conquered
God said this about Jesus, not the angels

OT Passages: Heb. 1:13; Ps. 110:1; Acts 2:32-36

Peter explained this in Acts
He spoke to men of Israel in Jerusalem on the day of Pentecost
God raised Jesus and exalted Him to His right hand

OT Passages: Heb. 1:13; Ps. 110:1; Acts 2:32-36

Peter said this reference in Psalm 110 was in regard to Jesus, not David God made Him both Lord and Christ
