

**Hebrews Part 1: Jesus, our Merciful and Faithful High Priest**  
**Lesson 7: Chapter 2 – “How the Believer benefits from being made like Jesus” Homework**

1. Our study this week is Hebrews 2:10-18. Read this portion and summarize it in 10-words or less.

3. We have concluded that the phrase “son of man,” in Hebrews 2:6, (and Psalm 8) is a reference to mankind. What are the words or phrases in the remainder of the chapter that apply to these persons, if they do not “neglect so great a salvation” (v. 3)?

5. Consider “subject” and “subjection” in Hebrews 2:5, 8, and 15. What is going to be subject to whom? Is this subjection taking place now? (This question is a carry-over from last week’s homework.)
6. When man sinned, he lost dominion over the earth. He died spiritually, became a slave to sin, and came under Satan’s power. Read Hebrews 2:14-15. Who had the power of death (v. 14), and who were subject to slavery all their lives (v. 15)? What questions do these observations/questions raise in your mind?
7. Therefore, according to Hebrews 2:9, 14, and 17, what was Jesus made and why?
8. In light of Ephesians 1:22-23 and 2:4-7, what is our present position as children of God, redeemed by Christ from Death’s power?
9. In verse 10, what is the benefit believers gain through Christ’s suffering and death?
10. In verse 11, what is the benefit believers gain? Who is the “He” who provides this benefit?
11. In verses 14-16, how does the suffering and death of Christ provide security? ...and for whom?
12. How is Christ able to “come to the aid of those who are tempted?” Tempted by whom?
