a) The identity of the one being reviewed

<u>Mark</u>: "The beginning of the gospel of Jesus Christ, the Son of God."

Identifies the Person and Official Status

Calls His story the "Good News"

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John: "...the Word was with God, and the Word was God. ...all things came into being through Him..."

"The Word became flesh, and dwelt among us, and we saw His glory..."

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John: "...the Word was with God, and the Word was God. ...all things came into being through Him..." (and <u>Matthew</u>)

"The Word became flesh, and dwelt among us, and we saw His glory..."

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Luke: "...investigated everything carefully from the beginning, to write it out for you in consecutive order..."


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"We" in the Acts of the Apostles.

Every chapter - unique info 250+ Greek words only in Luke 7 of 9 prayers in Luke - only



When do these events happen?

In the days of Herod, the Great who died c. 4 B.C.

He had been king of Judea for 33 years.

Focus on just the first 4 verses.

- to compile a carefully investigated account in consecutive order, of the things written or told by eyewitnesses about the life and work of Jesus.
- ·Likely written by Luke to a "Theophilus"
- The only Gospel written in consecutive order as reported by eyewitnesses.

Definition of "Consecutive Order" (v. 3)

- ·kathexes (καθεξη^ˆς, 2517) kata, "according to," + hexes (ἑξη^ˆς, 1836) "afterward," or "in order"
- •Luke <u>7:9-11</u>; 8:1; <u>9:36-37</u>; Acts 3:24; <u>11:3-4</u>; <u>18:22-23</u>; 21:1; 25:17; 27:18.
