- · Jesus is tempted many times by the devil.
- · Mainly Christ's healing, his concern for women and the poor.
- · Jesus has authority over the devil his and his demons.
- · Jesus rebukes the devil and teaches and heals the people.

Summarize the Whole of Luke 4 in 10-words

Testing of Jesus, the man, and demonstrations of Spirit-led power.

Note the word "LED" in Luke 4 Who is leading whom? Any Insights?

- ·v. 1 "led around <u>by the Spirit</u>"
- ·v. 5 The devil led Jesus and showed Him all the kingdoms of the world.
- •v. 9 <u>The devil</u> led Jesus to the pinnacle of the Temple in Jerusalem.
- v. 13 <u>The devil</u> left Jesus "until an opportune time."
- ·v. 29 They... led Him to the brow of the hill...

- 3 And the devil said to Him +, "If You + are the Son of God +, tell this stone to become bread."
- And Jesus answered him, "It is written, "MAN SHALL NOT LIVE ON BREAD ALONE."
- 5 ^aAnd he led Him† up and showed Him† all the kingdoms of ^{1b}the world in a moment of time.
- 6 And the devil said to Him⁺, "I will give You⁺ all this domain and 'its glory; afor it has been handed over to me, and I give it to whomever I wish.
- 7 "Therefore if You township before me, it shall all be Yours to ."

- And Jesus answered and said to him, "It is said, "AYOU SHALL NOT PUT THE LORD YOUR GOD TO THE TEST."
- When the devil had finished every temptation, he left Him tuntil an opportune time.

How Jesus faced each temptation

vs. 2-4 – make stones into bread:

He quotes Deut. 8:3a – just the first part

In context of Deut. 8, what was the bread?

What was Israel's lesson?

What was the temptation to Jesus?

How Jesus faced each temptation

- vs. 5-8 bow down /worship the devil and receive all the kingdoms of the world:
- Jesus would "worship the Lord God and serve Him only." (Deut. 10:20)
- In Isa. 14.14 Satan wants to be "<u>like</u>" the Most-High God... to replace Him and be worshiped.
- What was the temptation to Jesus?

How Jesus faced each temptation

vs. 9-13 — Cast yourself down (600 ft) and God will save you:

Jesus called this a test of God.

cf. Ex. 17:7 – Testing the Lord at Massah

How would this have been tempting or testing GOD?

Two Primary Resources in Facing Temptation

The Holy Spirit

The Word of God

Why these two?

What might be a third resource we could use in facing temptation?

1 John 2:15

15 Do not love the world nor the things in the world. If anyone loves the world, the love of the Father is not in him. 16 For all that is in the world, the <u>lust of</u> the flesh and the lust of the eyes and the boastful pride of life, is not from the Father, but is from the world.

Stones to Bread: Meet physical needs, independent of God. Desire of the Flesh

Worship the Devil:

Achievement or Success w/o cost

Desire of the Eyes

Force God to Rescue You:
Immediate personal recognition
Boastful Pride of Life

Stones to Bread Worship Satan Make God rescue you

All three would be completely self-serving.
