

Read through the entire passage (Chapter 3:1 – 4:22) for this lesson.

1. Last week Mike made note of a “Prescriptive Observation” in Acts 2:38. A similar verse is found in Chapter 3. What is that verse? What is the command?

Acts 3:1-10

2. How does this chapter begin? What was the event?

Acts 3:11-26

3. What happened because of this healing?
4. Peter responds with, “Men of Israel, why do you wonder at this, or why do you stare at us, as though by our own power or piety we have made him walk?” How did Peter say the man was able to walk?
5. Peter took opportunity with the crowd gathered to witness about Jesus again. What are some of the highlights that he pointed out?
6. There are similarities in this message with the message that Peter gave at Pentecost. What are the key points about Jesus that he brings up again?
7. According to verses 20-26, what did the prophets foretell?

Acts 4:1-4

8. What happens as Peter's message continues into Chapter 4?

Acts 4:5-12

9. What happens on the next day?

10. Note the "narrowness" or "exclusivity" of the salvation message in verse 12. Does this create conflict with the world we live in today?

Acts 4:13-22

11. What was the result of Peter's witness in these verses?

12. Based on the context of Acts 2 and 3, what showed Peter's and John's confidence / boldness?

13. What was the leaders' response to the actions of Peter and John?

14. Relate the witness of Peter and John here in Acts 4:13-22 with Acts 1:8.
