

To whom is the Epistle of Hebrews written? What do we know about them and their "faith condition?"

Hebrews 11 is all about "Faith."

How does <u>Romans 1:5</u> define the practice of "Faith?"

List the author's OBSERVATIONS & EXHORTATIONS in 10:19-11:40

O: We have confidence to enter the Holy Place by the blood of Jesus.

O: We have a great High Priest over the House of God.

O: Our hearts are sprinkled clean from an evil Conscience.

E: <u>Let Us</u> draw near to God in full assurance of faith.

O=Observations E=Exhortations O: He who promised is faithful. E: Let Us hold fast the confession of our hope without wavering. E: Let Us stimulate one another to love and good deeds.

O: As you see the day of Christ's return drawing near,
E: Don't forsake our own assembling together... encourage one another

O: There is no other means of forgiveness if one goes on willfully sinning.
O: If one rejects Christ's forgiveness, there is only God's judgement.

E: Remember the suffering you have already endured as believers in Christ (v. 32)

E: Do not throw away your proven confidence which has great reward. (v. 35)

E: Endure, do the will of God, and receive what He has promised.

O: Yet a little while Jesus will return and be pleased by our living by faith.

O: True faith is the confident obedience to God's Word, no matter what!
O: True faith is the inward assurance that God will keep His Word.

For all of Chapter 11

O: By their faith, previous believers gained God's approval! (11:2)

Summarize in 10-words or less the overall admonition of the passage.

Faith in God and His Word alone gains His Favor.

Focus on what some have called the "Lettuce Patch." (10:19-25)

Which of these three "let us" challenges do you think is most important? And, WHY?

"Let us <u>draw near</u> to God with a sincere heart in full assurance of faith..." (Heb. 10:22)

"Let us <u>hold fast</u> the confession of our hope without wavering, for He who promised is faithful." (Heb. 10:23) "...you will seek the LORD your God, and you will find Him if you <u>search for Him</u> with all your heart and all your soul."

Deuteronomy 4:29

"...I am commanding you... to love the LORD your God, to walk in all His ways and hold fast to Him,

Deuteronomy 11:22

What distinctions (if any) do you see between those who were "duing in faith" (11:4-13) and those who were "living by faith" (11:17-39).

"Dying in Faith" - They believed in God for His rewards yet to come, of life "here-after."

"Living by Faith" - They believed God for the provision he promised in this life.

Carefully read Hebrews 11 and record any personal lessons you learn about how you might strengthen your faith.
