Hebrews 2:5-18

10-words or less

*Jesus' completed mission
required his suffering, death,
resurrection, and help.*

Word Studies

perfect – Hebrews 2:10 – τελειόω (*teleioō*). *to complete, fulfill, finish, make perfect. ...being qualified to perform a specific work.*

sanctify – Hebrews 2:11 – ἀγιάζω (*hagiazō*). *To consecrate, to make holy, sanctify, hallow, treat as holy. Describes the divine act of setting aside for a special purpose or use.*

Word Studies

tempted – Hebrews 2:18 – πειράζω (peirazō). to test, try, attempt, prove, tempt, examine, entice to sin. The act of testing or tempting people.

suffered – Hebrews 2:18 – πάσχω (paschō). Experiencing physical, mental, or spiritual suffering. ...typically of the Lord Jesus Christ or His followers.

“neglect so great a salvation”

The phrase “son of man,” in Hebrews 2:6, (and Psalm 8) is a reference to mankind. What are the words or phrases in the remainder of the chapter that apply to these persons?

*“lower than angels” – “crowned with glory & honor” –
“appointed over the works of God’s hands” – “sons of One
Father” – “those who are sanctified” – “brothers” –*

*“children given by God” – “those who were subject to
slavery all their lives” – “people” – “who are tempted.”*

- *To make propitiation for the sins of people*

God, redeemed by Christ
from Death's power?*

...when He raised Him from the dead and seated Him at His right hand in the heavenly places, far above all rule and authority and power and dominion, and every name that is named, not only in this age but also in the one to come. And, He put all things in subjection under His feet, and gave Him as head over all things to the church, which is His body, the fullness of Him who fills all in all.

But God, being rich in mercy, because of His great love with which He loved us, even when we were dead in our transgressions, made us alive together with Christ and raised us up with Him, and seated us with Him in the heavenly places in Christ Jesus, so that in the ages to come He might show the surpassing riches of His grace in kindness toward us in Christ Jesus.
