**OVERVIEW:** When you Outlined Hebrews 9, what observations or insights came to your mind?

*Hebrews 9 in 10-words or less.*

*The First Covenant fell short,  
but the New Covenant excelled.*

*The daily activity in the Tabernacle took place in the outer courtyard (around the bronze altar and the laver), as well as in the first part of the Tent of Meeting (the Holy Place). However, the Holy of Holies, the most Holy Place within the veil was entered only on one day each year, the Day of Atonement.*

Priests carried on routine activity in the Outer Courtyard and the Holy Place (outside the veil).

Look-up the Greek word  
“Conscience”

*συνείδησις (syneidēsis). n. fem.  
conscience, self-awareness.*

*Refers to a person’s internal witness to  
their own behavior, the guilt over  
wrongdoing and the satisfaction of  
choosing right over wrong. .*
