Lighting of the Advent Candle

Jesus is coming, shout for joy! Joy is a word we see and hear everywhere at Christmas. Joy to the world is the message of the season. Joy is the theme of this day.

Two weeks ago we lit the **Prophecy candle** and remembered those who first spoke the promise of the coming Christ child.

Last week we lit the **Bethlehem candle**, a symbol of the preparations being made to receive and cradle the Christ child.

The **third** candle on the Advent wreath is called the **Shepherds'** candle. It is also known as the candle of **joy**. It remembers the first in a long line of people who joyfully shared the good news of the Savior's birth. The candle is a **different color**, reminding us that our period of waiting is half over.

Psalm 146 praises the Lord as the Creator of the world and the Provider for his people. The psalm contains a wonderful "catalog" of the loving deeds of God, who gives food to the hungry and raises

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up those who are bowed down. The words remind us of the answer Jesus gave when John the Baptist asked him if he was the Messiah.

Hear the Word of the Lord: (Psalm 146:5-10)

Blessed is he whose help is the God of Jacob, whose hope is in the LORD his God, ⁶ who made heaven and earth, the sea, and all that is in them, who keeps faith forever; ⁷ who executes justice for the oppressed, who gives food to the hungry. The LORD sets the prisoners free; ⁸ the LORD opens the eyes of the blind. The LORD lifts up those who are bowed down; the LORD loves the righteous. ⁹ The LORD watches over the sojourners; he upholds the widow and the fatherless, but the way of the wicked he brings to ruin. ¹⁰ The LORD will reign forever, your God, O Zion, to all generations. Praise the LORD!
