Public Confession of Sin

ALL: Have mercy upon me, O God, according to Your loving kindness: according unto the multitude of Your tender mercies blot out my transgressions. Wash me thoroughly from my iniquity, and cleanse me from my sin. For I acknowledge my transgressions: and my sin is ever before me. Against You, You only, have I sinned, and done this evil in Your sight: that You might be justified when You speak, and be clear when You judge. Public Reading of Scripture

Ruth 1:1-5

(Lectio Continua – the practice of reading Scripture in sequence)

Scripture Context:

The book of Ruth tells a story of redemption that took place during the days of the judges - when everyone did what was right in their own eyes. Here we are introduced to an exception and not the rule. The story is designed to introduce us to the coming king from the tribe of Judah from whom the Messiah is to come according to the flesh – the true Judge and Deliverer of Israel.

In the days when the judges ruled there was a famine in the land, and a man of Bethlehem in Judah went to sojourn in the country of Moab, he and his wife and his two sons. ² The name of the man was Elimelech and the name of his wife Naomi, and the names of his two sons were Mahlon

and Chilion. They were Ephrathites from Bethlehem in Judah. They went into the country of Moab and remained there. ³ But Elimelech, the husband of Naomi, died, and she was left with her two sons. ⁴ These took Moabite wives; the name of the one was Orpah and the name of the other Ruth. They lived there about ten years, ⁵ and both Mahlon and Chilion died, so that the woman was left without her two sons and her husband.
