Weekend Reflection

“For you are a people holy to the LORD your God. The LORD your God has chosen you to be a people for his treasured possession, out of all the peoples who are on the face of the earth... it is because the Lord loves you.” -Deuteronomy 7:6,8a

Why did God choose Israel? It wasn't because they were the biggest nation or the most noble or the nation that had the most promise.

It was because God loved them. How precious is that truth! God loved Israel, and that his why, out of all the nations on Earth, he chose her to be his people, and to pour out his blessings on the nations.
