Weekend Reflection

But for me it is good to be near God; I have made the Lord GOD my refuge, that I may tell of all your works. – Psalm 73:28

We completed our journey through Leviticus this week! Has your sense of God's holiness grown? And your appreciation for his grace? Of course, there are so many connections to the gospel in Leviticus (for e.g., instructions for the Day of Atonement), and it is good for us to read these precious Scriptures.

It ought to draw us close to the Lord and to say, with the Psalmist, *I have made the Lord GOD my refuge*. Our hope for everything, must be in Jesus Christ. It is good to be near God.

And note how that nearness springs into ministry. The Psalmist again: *that I may tell of all your works*. Leviticus reminds us of God, his holiness, our sinfulness, and God's grace. Therefore, we make God our refuge (though Christ). And then we go and tell others of all his works!

SUNDAY SERMON

The sermon for Sunday, March 17, is on John 2:23-25. On this special Sunday, Pastor Dana Olson will return to the pulpit at Faith to preach Jesus' knowledge of what is in man. Read that passage ahead of time to prepare your heart for the preaching of God's Word.
