Weekend Reflection

Often, at the very conclusion of a Sunday gathering at Faith, a pastor will say this:

The Lord bless you and keep you; the Lord make his face to shine upon you and be gracious to you; the Lord lift up his countenance upon you and give you peace.

We read that passage - Numbers 6:24-26 - this week! And what a blessing it is to consider. It was the Lord who gave instructions for Aaron and his sons to bless the people this way.
