## Weekend Reflection

Much of what we read in Deuteronomy this week outlines the blessings for obedience and the curses for disobedience. Following God and his commandments bring blessing and flourishing. Disobedience to God never brings flourishing. You will never flourish in active disobedience.

Doesn't that expose the lie of sin? We sin because we think that sin will be better for us. We buy the lie that disobedience is better than obedience. Yet, the outcome is always the same; disobedience leads to heartache, strife and even God's judgment, while obedience leads to flourishing.

At the end of the day, it is the obedience of Christ that brings our true and everlasting flourishing. Jesus obeyed the Father, and he died for our disobedience (and rose again, making our obedience possible!). All who trust in Christ flourish forever!

Would that we would trust God and his Word. He knows what is best for us!
