Weekend Reflection

In our readings this week we saw David anointed king of Israel, and his kingdom established. David desired to build a temple to replace the tabernacle, but the Lord would not let him. The Lord then made a promise to David. The Lord said, "your throne shall be established forever".

The immediate fulfillment of this promise is that David's son, Solomon, assumed the throne after David and he built the temple that David wanted to build.

The ultimate fulfillment is that in David's direct line would come the greatest king ever, and his throne would be established forever (see Luke 1:33): the Son of David, the Christ, the King of kings, and the Lord of heaven and earth. God's promise to David was not only good news to David. It is good news for all nations. It is good news for you. It is the gospel.

Rejoice in the Lord today; whose kingdom will have no end.
