We have read the book of Ezra this week, including all six of the times that the author said, "...for the hand of the Lord his God was on him (Ezra 7:6d)" Throughout the book, we see God at work, stirring and acting for the good of his people. He even moves the hearts of wicked kings to accomplish his purposes.

This book records a wonderful time of spiritual renewal and even revival. A revival is not an event that is planned and conducted by people or organizations (not even churches!). As we can see in Ezra, it is a work of God! It is God who works, in his timing and in his way, to bring about revival in the hearts of his people.

The people sing in response, "[God] is good, for his steadfast love endures forever toward Israel." (Ezra 3:11)
