Weekend Reflection

When we prize something greatly, we want to show it off. You've got to see this! Come and see our new house, or camper, or car. Come and see! It is worth seeing.

In Psalm 66:5 we are encouraged to, "Come and see what God has done: he is awesome in his deeds toward the children of man."

We are on both sides of that invitation. We ourselves must come and see; come to the Word, come to his church, come and see what the Lord is doing among our brothers and sisters, and what he has done. Come and see every Sunday. Come and see every day. His works are awesome.

And, if we find in him our delight, that our constant refrain to those around us: come and see! His deeds are awesome towards us. The Lord is good! You've got to see this.

Let's joyfully come and see, and let's invite all to come and see. He is awesome in his deeds toward the children of man.

SUNDAY SERMON

Faith Groups

- How does this water satisfy our thirst forever? What does this mean practically in our spiritual lives?
- What was wrong with her final response, in verse 15?
- What can we learn from this conversation about Jesus’ love for the nations, and his love for individuals like this woman?
