How to know God's Word

- 1. Hear it! "So faith comes from hearing, and hearing the word of Christ." (Romans 10:17)
- **2. Read it!** "Blessed is he who reads and those who hear the words of the prophecy, and heed the things which are written in it; for the time is near." (Revelation 1:3)
- **3. Study it!** "[They] were more noble-minded than those in Thessalonica, for they received the word with great eagerness, examining the Scriptures daily to see whether these things were so." (Acts 17:11)
- **4. Memorize it!** "Your word I have treasured in my heart, that I may not sin against You." (Psalm 119:11)
- **5. Meditate on it!** "But his delight is in the law of the Lord, and in His law he meditates day and night." (Psalm 1:2)
- **6. Obey it!** "But prove yourselves to be doers of the word, and not merely hearers who delude themselves." (James 1:22)

The Bible Study Process

1. Preparation

- a. What should we do before we approach the Scriptures (1 Peter 2:1-2)?
- b. Read Colossians 1:9-10. What should we pray for as we prepare to study God's Word?

2. Observation

- a. Asks the question, "What do I see?"
 - i. Look for:
 - 1. Key words
 - 2. Key subjects
 - 3. Commands
 - 4. Warnings
 - 5. Repeated words or phrases
 - 6. Questions, answers given
 - 7. Anything unusual or unexpected
- b. What is the key subject of Colossians 1:15-20?

3. Interpretation

- a. Asks the question, "What does it mean?"
- b. We need to remember to keep the Scripture in its context.
- c. Whom has God given to teach us (1 John 2:27)?
- d. Bible study tools:
 - i. Other passages of Scripture
 - ii. Concordances (usually in the back of your Bible)
 - iii. Maps
 - iv. Study Bibles
 - v. Commentaries

4. Application

- a. Asks the question, "How does it work?" or "What effect will this have on my life?"
- b. Once we have heard the Word of God, what should our response be (James 1:22)?

5. Repetition

- a. Continue to grow in your knowledge of the Word and dive deeper into each passage.
- b. Don't think that because you have studied a passage once that you have discovered all the truths in that passage.
- c. We must continually be reminded of the truths of God's Word so that we might live a holy life.
- d. Continue to read God's Word!
