Look to Him, seeking.....Our daily bread

Confess to Him, pleading.....Forgive us our debts (sins)

Depend on Him, asking.....Do not lead us into temptation

Trust in Him, requesting.....Deliver us from evil

Four Important Areas of Prayer
Adoration..... Reflect on God Himself. Praise Him for His attributes, His majesty, and His gift of Christ.
Confession..... Admit to God that you have sinned. Be honest and humble. Remember, He knows you and loves you.
Thanksgiving..... Tell God how grateful you are for everything He has given you, even unpleasant things. Your thankfulness will help you see His purposes.
Supplication..... Make specific requests. Pray first for other and then for yourself.
