The number of sheep eventually became a problem because Abram and Lot were running out of land space for them all. *(Stand like you are squeezed in tight in a crowd of people.)*

The shepherds and herdsmen who were in charge of keeping watch over the animals began to fight over the land. *(Put your fists up like you're in a fight.)*

As Abram and Lot watched their flocks and livestock increase in number, they also began to notice the conflict between their shepherds and herdsmen. *(Hover your hand over your forehead like you're looking for something in the distance.)*

Abram proposed a plan to Lot. He decided he would rather part ways with his nephew rather than continue the fighting. *(Bring your hand to your chin, and rub it like you're thinking deeply.)*

Abram decided to let Lot choose which land he would prefer to have for his people and his animals to live on. Abram promised to go the opposite direction. *(Wave your hand in front of you, and step aside, as if you're allowing someone to go in front of you.)*

As Lot considered his options, he looked to one direction and saw beautiful, grassy fields and clear, rippling streams. *(Stand with your hands on your hips and face left.)*

Lot looked to the opposite direction, and saw a less lush land with a few trees. *(Stand with your hands on your hips and face right.)*

After much thought, Lot decided to take his people and animals and head in the direction of the abundant land and water. *(Wave and begin walking. Freeze in a pose that looks like you're walking away.)*

Even though Abram could have had the first choice, he chose to keep the peace by allowing Lot to take his pick. Abram showed that he cared by letting go of what was fair. *(Shrug your shoulders with your palms facing up.)*

Not only did Abram avoid a huge fight with Lot, but he also trusted God with the outcome. God was faithful by continuing to bless Abram again and again. Many years later, Jesus would be born into Abram's family line! And Jesus was the only one who could make peace between God and us. The end. *(Take a bow.)*



- How can you avoid acting this way?






Look up John 15:12-13 and answer these questions together:

- **What does it mean to lay down your life for your friends?**






Look up Matthew 20:16 and answer these questions together:
