

Moses and the Exodus (Weeks 43, 44 & 45)

- Exodus 3:20—So I will stretch out my hand and strike Egypt with all the wonders that I will do in it; after that he will let you go.
- Exodus 15:2—The LORD is my strength and my song, and he has become my salvation; this is my God, and I will praise him, my father's God, and I will exalt him.
- Deuteronomy 4:40—Therefore you shall keep his statutes and his commandments, which I command you today, that it may go well with you and with your children after you, and that you may prolong your days in the land that the Lord your God is giving you for all time.”

Solomon's Proverbs (Weeks 46, 47 & 48)

- Proverbs 14:12—There is a way that seems right to a man, but its end is the way to death.
- Proverbs 16:18-19—Pride goes before destruction, and a haughty spirit before a fall. It is better to be of a lowly spirit with the poor than to divide the spoil with the proud.
- Proverbs 22:6—Train up a child in the way he should go; even when he is old he will not depart from it.

Paul's Theology (Weeks 49, 50 & 51)

- Romans 5:8—but God shows his love for us in that while we were still sinners, Christ died for us.
- Romans 10:9-10—because, if you confess with your mouth that Jesus is Lord and believe in your heart that God raised him from the dead, you will be saved. For with the heart one believes and is justified, and with the mouth one confesses and is saved.
- Romans 12:2—Do not be conformed to this world, but be transformed by the renewal of your mind, that by testing you may discern what is the will of God, what is good and acceptable and perfect

God's Nature (Week 52)

- John 1:14—In him was life, and the life was the light of men.
- Hebrews 1:3—He is the radiance of the glory of God and the exact imprint of his nature, and he upholds the universe by the word of his power. After making purification for sins, he sat down at the right hand of the Majesty on high,

Jesus (Life & Teachings) (Weeks 1, 2 & 3)

- Luke 2:11—For unto you is born this day in the city of David a Savior, who is Christ the Lord.
- John 3:17—For God did not send his Son into the world to condemn the world, but in order that the world might be saved through him.
- John 15:5—I am the vine; you are the branches. Whoever abides in me and I in him, he it is that bears much fruit, for apart from me you can do nothing.

Paul (Life & Teachings) (Weeks 4, 5 & 6)

- Acts 9:22— But Saul increased all the more in strength, and confounded the Jews who lived in Damascus by proving that Jesus was the Christ.
- Romans 3:23-24— for all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God, and are justified by his grace as a gift, through the redemption that is in Christ Jesus
- Ephesians 2:8-9—For by grace you have been saved through faith. And this is not your own doing; it is the gift of God, not a result of works, so that no one may boast.

Old Testament (History) (Weeks 7, 8 & 9)

- Exodus 3:6—And he said, “I am the God of your father, the God of Abraham, the God of Isaac, and the God of Jacob.” And Moses hid his face, for he was afraid to look at God.
- 1 Kings 18:38-39—Then the fire of the LORD fell and consumed the burnt offering and the wood and the stones and the dust, and licked up the water that was in the trench. And when all the people saw it, they fell on their faces and said, “The LORD, he is God; the LORD, he is God.”
- Isaiah 53:5—But he was pierced for our transgressions; he was crushed for our iniquities; upon him was the chastisement that brought us peace, and with his wounds we are healed.

Psalms (Part 1) (Weeks 10, 11 & 12)

- Psalm 19:14—Let the words of my mouth and the meditation of my heart be acceptable in your sight, O LORD, my rock and my redeemer.
- Psalm 42:11—Why are you cast down, O my soul, and why are you in turmoil within me? Hope in God; for I shall again praise him, my salvation and my God.
- Psalm 91:1-2—He who dwells in the shelter of the Most High will abide in the shadow of the Almighty. I will say to the LORD, “My refuge and my fortress, my God, in whom I trust.”

Prayers of the Bible (Weeks 13, 14 & 15)

- Exodus 15:2—The LORD is my strength and my song, and he has become my salvation
- 2 Chronicles 20:6—and said, “O Lord, God of our fathers, are you not God in heaven? You rule over all the kingdoms of the nations. In your hand are power and might, so that none is able to withstand you.
- John 17:26—I made known to them your name, and I will continue to make it known, that the love with which you have loved me may be in them, and I in them.

Works of the Holy Spirit (Weeks 16, 17 & 18)

- John 16:13—When the Spirit of truth comes, he will guide you into all the truth, for he will not speak on his own authority, but whatever he hears he will speak, and he will declare to you the things that are to come.
- Romans 8:11—If the Spirit of him who raised Jesus from the dead dwells in you, he who raised Christ Jesus from the dead will also give life to your mortal bodies through his Spirit who dwells in you.
- 1 John 4:13-14—By this we know that we abide in him and he in us, because he has given us of his Spirit. And we have seen and testify that the Father has sent his Son to be the Savior of the world.

Psalms (Part 2) (Weeks 19, 20 & 21)

- Psalm 100:1-2—Make a joyful noise to the LORD, all the earth! Serve the LORD with gladness! Come into his presence with singing!
- Psalm 119:2-3—Blessed are those who keep his testimonies, who seek him with their whole heart, who also do no wrong, but walk in his ways!
- Psalm 139:12—even the darkness is not dark to you; the night is bright as the day, for darkness is as light with you.

Women of the Bible (Weeks 22, 23 & 24)

- Genesis 18:14—Is anything too hard for the Lord? At the appointed time I will return to you, about this time next year, and Sarah shall have a son.
- 1 Samuel 1:27-28—For this child I prayed, and the LORD has granted me my petition that I made to him. Therefore I have lent him to the LORD. As long as he lives, he is lent to the LORD.” And he worshiped the LORD there.
- Luke 8:47—And when the woman saw that she was not hidden, she came trembling, and falling down before him declared in the presence of all the people why she had touched him, and how she had been immediately healed.

Paul’s Protesges (Weeks 25, 26 & 27)

- 1 Timothy 6:12—Fight the good fight of the faith. Take hold of the eternal life to which you were called and about which you made the good confession in the presence of many witnesses.
- 2 Timothy 3:16-17—All Scripture is breathed out by God and profitable for teaching, for reproof, for correction, and for training in righteousness, that the man of God may be complete, equipped for every good work.
- Titus 3:5-6—he saved us, not because of works done by us in righteousness, but according to his own mercy, by the washing of regeneration and renewal of the Holy Spirit, whom he poured out on us richly through Jesus Christ our Savior,

Men of the Old Testament (Weeks 28, 29 & 30)

- Joshua 1:9—Have I not commanded you? Be strong and courageous. Do not be frightened, and do not be dismayed, for the Lord your God is with you wherever you go.”
- 1 Kings 17:22—And the Lord listened to the voice of Elijah. And the life of the child came into him again, and he revived.
- Isaiah 6:8—And I heard the voice of the Lord saying, “Whom shall I send, and who will go for us?” Then I said, “Here I am! Send me.”

Miracles of Jesus (Weeks 31, 32 & 33)

- Matthew 8:28—And when he came to the other side, to the country of the Gadarenes, two demon-possessed men met him, coming out of the tombs, so fierce that no one could pass that way.
- Mark 7:37—And they were astonished beyond measure, saying, “He has done all things well. He even makes the deaf hear and the mute speak.”
- John 11:44—The man who had died came out, his hands and feet bound with linen strips, and his face wrapped with a cloth. Jesus said to them, “Unbind him, and let him go.”

Parable of Jesus (Weeks 34, 35 & 36)

- Matthew 13:17—For truly, I say to you, many prophets and righteous people longed to see what you see, and did not see it, and to hear what you hear, and did not hear it.
- Luke 10:36-37—Which of these three, do you think, proved to be a neighbor to the man who fell among the robbers?” He said, “The one who showed him mercy.” And Jesus said to him, “You go, and do likewise.”
- Luke 15:7—Just so, I tell you, there will be more joy in heaven over one sinner who repents than over ninety-nine righteous persons who need no repentance.

Life of David (Weeks 37, 38 & 39)

- 1 Samuel 17:45—Then David said to the Philistine, “You come to me with a sword and with a spear and with a javelin, but I come to you in the name of the Lord of hosts, the God of the armies of Israel, whom you have defied.
- 2 Samuel 7:2-3—the king said to Nathan the prophet, “See now, I dwell in a house of cedar, but the ark of God dwells in a tent.” And Nathan said to the king, “Go, do all that is in your heart, for the LORD is with you.”
- 2 Samuel 12:13—David said to Nathan, “I have sinned against the Lord.” And Nathan said to David, “The Lord also has put away your sin; you shall not die.

Paul’s Prison Epistles (Weeks 40, 41 & 42)

- Ephesians 6:10—Finally, be strong in the Lord and in the strength of his might.
- Philippians 4:8—Finally, brothers, whatever is true, whatever is honorable, whatever is just, whatever is pure, whatever is lovely, whatever is commendable, if there is any excellence, if there is anything worthy of praise, think about these things.
- Colossians 1:19-20—For in him all the fullness of God was pleased to dwell, and through him to reconcile to himself all things, whether on earth or in heaven, making peace by the blood of his cross.
