TODAY'S READING: Acts 19

I have personally always liked this passage from Acts 19. I have often thought of it as funny. I find humor throughout the Bible whether the humor is intended or not.

In Acts 19, we read about God doing extraordinary miracles through Paul. Then the focus turns to a few traveling Jewish exorcists. These men foolishly decide to invoke the name of Jesus over those who had evil spirits. The evil spirit replies that he knows Jesus and recognizes Paul, but he does not know them. The result of this exchange is the Jewish exorcists fleeing beaten, battered and naked. These men were beat down for pretending to be something they were not, followers of Christ.

Have you ever pretended to be something you are not? We all have. It could be embellishing our achievements or status to make us look more successful. It could be bragging on the accomplishments of our children so it reflects positively on our parenting. The list of ways that we do not present our true selves could go on and on. We can look in the mirror and feel like a fraud. Either way, we must confront the reality of who we really are or choose to push those feelings down so we do not have to deal with them.

The story of the Sons of Sceva is a cautionary tale to us. When we choose to pretend to be someone we are not, it can leave us feeling battered and beaten. However, we have something that the Sons of Sceva did not have. We are children of the King of the Universe! The same power that raised Christ from the grave dwells in us (Romans 8:11).
