READING: Luke 10

As we read Luke 10:2, we ask, "Where are the laborers or workers?" Is Jesus such a cruel master that nobody can work for Him or with Him? Is the harvest so unimportant that the church can afford to ignore it? The spectators are not few, nor are the critics.

One reason for the lack of workers is that many of God's people are blind and do not notice the ripened fields or the missing workers. What we see with our eyes is largely determined by what we love in our hearts. Along with blindness, some of God's people are guilty of prayerlessness. Those who sincerely pray for workers often become workers themselves.

No farmer gathers the harvest while sitting on the porch swing sipping iced tea. Neither should a Christian worker expect to win souls for Christ without rolling up his or her sleeves and working in the fields. Many Christians pray the Lord's Prayer faithfully, including "Your kingdom come, Your will be done on earth as it is in heaven." If you really mean that, then get ready. God has work for you to do.

PRAYER: "Lord, give me a heart for lost people. Open my eyes and ignite my prayer life to help me not only see the harvest but use me to become a worker for Your harvest."
