Seeking God for Revival and Spiritual Awakening

"For I know the plans I have for you," declares the LORD, "plans to prosper you and not to harm you, plans to give you hope and a future. Then you will call upon me and come and pray to me, and I will listen to you. You will seek me and find me when you seek me with all your heart." (Jeremiah 29:11–13)

"Now to him who is able to do immeasurably more than all we ask or imagine, according to his power that is at work within us, to him be glory in the church and in Christ Jesus throughout all generations, for ever and ever! Amen." (Ephesians 3:20–21)

"Call to Me, and I will . . . show you great and mighty things, which you do not know." (Jeremiah 33:3 NKJV)

As we begin 2015 together I want to invite you once again to join me in seeking God for a Spiritual Revival in our lives individually, in our families, in our church fellowship, in our community and our world. I am going to challenge us to begin the year seeking the face of God through a concentrated time of prayer and fasting. I will share more about this during the morning services on Sunday, January 4. There are several ways you can be involved:

- 1. Pick up a copy of the book, *Prayer for Revival* by Dr. Francois Carr and pray through this guide for at least the 21 days of prayer and fasting (January 11-31).
- 2. Fast from food for all or at least some of the 21 days of prayer and fasting through a partial or normal fast (more about these types of fasts during the message on January 4).
- 3. Reduce by half your intake of non-work related media for the 21 days of prayer and fasting and give that extra time to passionately seeking the face of God and aligning your will and every aspect of your life with God's purposes and plans.
- 4. Join with others in times of prayer together in groups, seeking God together for a spiritual break-through as we begin the new year. *Save The Date:* Sunday, February 8, we will come together for a special time of corporate prayer as a church family!

Samuel L. Brengle wrote, "All great revivals have been preceded and carried out by persevering, prevailing knee-work in the closet." If ever there was a time when we needed a revival, a spiritual breakthrough in our lives, our families, our churches and our nation, now is the time!

Is God calling you to be one of those who will begin the year seeking the face and the hand of God more passionately and purposefully than you ever have before? I look forward to seeing what God is going to do as His people follow the pattern of 2 Chronicles 7:14: "if my people, who are called by my name, will humble themselves and pray and seek my face and turn from their wicked ways, then will I hear from heaven and will forgive their sin and will heal their land."


Zip for Kids (K-5th)

Farewell Friends

December 31, 2014, will be the marker of two events in my life and in the history of FBCFM. First, I will complete seven years of serving here. My family and I felt God's call to come here after having served ten years with the International Mission Board among the Zulu of South Africa. I had no other plans than serving with the IMB, but God changed the plans I had and led us here. I do not suggest that I understand the reasons for this shift in ministry but we are assured that our time here has been God's plan for us.

Second, we are convinced that our ministry here at FBCFM is completed. God has made it very clear that it is time to take the next step on our ministry trail. Our last day is Wednesday, December 31. I somewhat feel like Abraham when God spoke to him and told him to go to the country which He would show him. We do not know what, when or where our next step will lead us. The only assurance we have is that He is leading.

I would not be true to my nature if I did not, for one last time, encourage you to continue using your spiritual giftedness, your talents and your resources to advance the Kingdom of God in Fort Mill. Because of your efforts we have many reasons to say "Yeah God," three major ones taking place in the past two years. You have given more to our Faith Commitment Offering, more of you have gone "on mission," and because of this more have been baptized than any time in previous years.

Because of your commitments we are also seeing a number of our young men and women committing their lives to vocational ministry. This is something that can only be explained by a movement of the Holy Spirit / that God is at work at FBCFM.

We would like to thank all of you who have supported us, encouraged us and loved on us during our time here. We will take many, many fond memories with us. We ask that you pray with us that we will be sensitive to the Holy Spirit and His leading. We are open to go where God would have us go and do whatever God would have us do. My only fear is that I may get in the way!

We believe God hears and answers the prayers of His children. We covet your prayers and we promise to pray for you as we go. We believe the best years for FBCFM could be ahead and we will pray that for you. Let me close with a word from *the* Word. Paul expressed his thanksgiving to the church at Philippi which expresses my sentiment toward you so well.

"I thank my God every time I remember you. In all my prayers for all of you, I always pray with joy because of your partnership in the gospel from the first day until now, being confident of this, that he who began a good work in you will carry it on to completion until the day of Christ Jesus." Philippians 1:3-6

May our Lord bless every effort you make.

It's Sunday morning. You finally made it through the one lane of traffic not quarantined by the orange cones that descended overnight like locusts. You carefully maneuver the parking labyrinth as your child kicks the back of your car seat. By the time your small tribe disembarks the fun bus, you consider the hike to the lobby and wonder if you should ration food for the journey. You temporarily sign over your parental rights to the twitchy-eyed nursery staff and sneak a contraband coffee cup into the worship center. As you slide into to a back pew and let out a sigh, you think to yourself, *Finally, I'm ready for some God-and-me time!* Right? Wrong. Well, incomplete to say the least. Certainly, you *are* right to come expectant to encounter God in a special way on a Sunday morning. But there's an important difference between a collective quiet time and corporate worship.

The Joy of the Assembly

Jesus' Bible was divided into three sections: the Law, the Prophets, and the Writings. The Writings make up the final section, and depict the joy and blessings of living in covenant relationship with Yahweh. Interestingly, the references to "the assembly" of God's people escalate dramatically as we approach the end of the Hebrew canon. It's as if the Hebrew Bible flares out in celebration over the assembly as one of the chief gifts of covenant life. The overwhelming majority (over half!) of these references are in the ruthlessly optimistic final book, Chronicles. Chronicles depicts David as one who assembles all Israel (1 Chronicles 11:1; 13:2, 8) to worship Yahweh together. "Then David said to all the assembly, "Bless the LORD your God." And all the assembly blessed the LORD, the God of their fathers, and bowed their heads and paid homage to the LORD and to the king." (1 Chronicles 29:20)

It is a good and precious thing to commune with the Living God. But the Writings ring with the peal that it is even more joyful to share that experience together with your brothers and sisters.

The Wisdom of the Church

Chronicles launches the reader to anticipate one of the great realities of the New Testament — the creation of the Christian Church. The Messianic hope of Chronicles makes us look for a new anointed king who will assemble together the people of God. We are not surprised, then, when a new Son of David makes this climactic pronouncement: "I will build my church, and the gates of hell shall not prevail against it." (Matthew 16:18) After all, that word "church," or ekklesia, is the same word that the Greek translation of the Old Testament uses for the "assembly" of Israel. Jesus fulfills the Messianic profile found in Chronicles by assembling a New Covenant people. And this assembly cannot be stopped by all of hell's fury: "So the church throughout all Judea and Galilee and Samaria had peace and was being built up. And walking in the fear of the Lord and in the comfort of the Holy Spirit, it multiplied." (Acts 9:31) "Through the church the manifold wisdom of God might now be made known to the rulers and authorities in the heavenly places." (Ephesians 3:10)

The assembly of the people of God was a marvelous thing, even a few times a year in Jerusalem during the Old Covenant. And now, in God's wisdom and grace, he manifests his spiritual presence in unique and special ways in the Church (see Matthew 18:17, 20; 1 Corinthians 3:16), the regular assembly of New Covenant people across the world. So when you make it to your pew on Sunday morning, you *are* encountering God. But in a remarkable way, you are doing so *with others*. Worshiping God shoulder-to-shoulder is one of the greatest joys of covenant relationship with God.

Honoring the Host

It might help to think of an analogy. If you host a dinner party and invite a few friends from different social circles, how disappointing would it be if your friends only chose to interact with you? One of the great joys of hosting is connecting people you love to one another.

When we treat corporate worship like it's our private meeting with God, we not only dishonor our great Host, but we rob ourselves of the joy of sharing our mutual love for the King who has invited us to His banquet. Only we gather not from different social circles, but from every tribe, tongue, people and family (Revelation 5:9). We honor the Host when we say with that famous Assembler King, "As for the saints in the land, they are the excellent ones, in whom is all my delight" (Psalm 16:3).

Don't neglect the great gift of the covenant. We worship Jesus together.

The words stung sharply as soon as they came out of his mouth, "When no one has access to your heart, you become dangerous to yourself and others." Andy Stanley continued with his sermon, but my mind and heart stayed right there. We are so prone to isolation, but that response is just like fighting your way out of quicksand. It's a self-defeating response. It seems reflexive in the moment, but it actually does damage to us in the end. It's like avoiding going to the dentist because you fear the pain you might experience, even if it is best for you.

What's the opposite of this? What happens when someone does have access to our hearts? According to this phrase you would become helpful to yourself and others. It becomes life-giving for you and those around you. Is it hard? Yes! We don't want people to know our junk. We don't want people messing around in our lives, pointing out our inconsistencies. But is it good? Also yes! It's exactly why God has designed the church body and exactly what He wants for your life. He wants us in each others lives, pushing each other towards Christ. So how will you give someone access to your heart? One way you could do this is by being this type of person in a Life Group. There is no better time than now to join a group. 
