Everyday Missionaries

And he said to them, "Follow me, and I will make you fishers of men" (Matthew 4:19).

Every follower of Jesus Christ is called to be an everyday missionary! Everyday missionaries are those who practice life on mission with God wherever God has placed them; in their neighborhoods, workplaces, campuses, social circles or another country. The explosive spread of the gospel in the book of Acts took place primarily not because of great buildings, programs or personalities. The spread of the gospel took place primarily because ordinary men and women, empowered by the extraordinary presence of God, were proclaiming the gospel everywhere they went. They understood that the Great Commission was not a choice to be considered but a command to be obeyed.

Our role as everyday missionaries is to introduce people to Jesus, actively be a part of their journey to become like Jesus and equip them to repeat the process with others. The ultimate aim of our lives is to bring glory to God.

Being an everyday missionary is not about adding something else to our already overcrowded schedules. It is about interjecting gospel intentionality into our everyday routines.

On Sunday, March 8, in all three morning worship services, we will begin challenging and equipping one another to live as everyday missionaries. There are 28 days from March 8 until Easter Sunday, April 5. We will challenge one another to interject gospel intentionality into our everyday routines for that 28-day period leading up to Easter Sunday. We will do this in three specific ways:

1. **Encouraging** one another to pray as everyday missionaries.
2. **Equipping** you with a very simple tool, **3 Circles: Life Conversation Guide**, to help you more easily share your faith. This is a tool that you can draw on a piece of paper, give as a printed guide to someone or use as an app on your smart phone to share the gospel of Jesus Christ.
3. **Enhancing** your focus toward becoming an everyday missionary with a 14-day follow-up devotional study, **Nobodies For Jesus 14 Days Toward A Great Commission Lifestyle**. This brief devotional study will help all of us ordinary people to be used in extraordinary ways for the gospel of Jesus Christ as everyday missionaries.

Let's make it a priority to come together on Sunday, March 8, to reorient our hearts and sharpen our skills to live life as an everyday missionary!

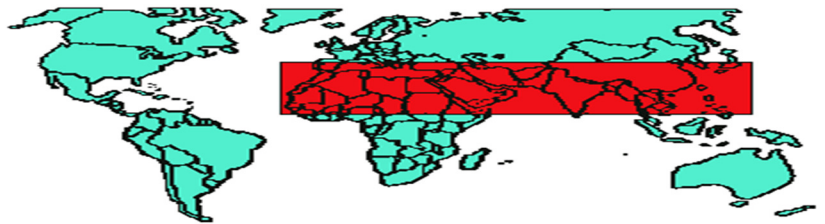
JOIN A SUNDAY MORNING FELLOWSHIP

10/40 Window (Last Frontier)

The 10/40 Window (also known as the Last Frontier) describes the areas of Africa and Asia from 10 degrees latitude north of the equator to 40 degrees latitude north of the equator.

- More than 4.4 billion people (2/3 of the world’s population) live in the 10/40 Window.
- 95% of the people living in the 10/40 Window are un-evangelized. Many have never heard the Gospel message even once.
- Of the 55 least evangelized countries, 97% of their population lives within the 10/40 Window.
- 85% of those living in the 10/40 Window are the poorest of the world’s poor.
- Islam, Buddhism and Hinduism are centered within the 10/40 Window.



Viewing the map from left to right the Muslim world can be seen most prominently in a wide band across the north of Africa into the Middle East, a block representing over 900 million Muslims. In the middle of the map, overshadowing the subcontinent of India is the presence of Hinduism, also constituting a population of nearly 600 million Hindus. On the right side of the map is the Buddhist world, encompassing the whole of China, a population of more than 300 million Buddhists.

"And this gospel of the kingdom will be preached in all the world as a witness to all the nations, and then the end will come" (Matthew 24:14).

WORSHIP ARTS

The Worship Wheelbarrow

There's a tricky balance inherent in worship music: we strive to make beautiful music, not for the sake of beauty, but for the purpose of helping people love God more.

This is where I find the "worship wheelbarrow" metaphor helpful. Here's the elevator pitch: worship music is like a tremendously beautiful wheelbarrow, gorgeous to behold, breathtaking, inspiring – but – it's still a wheelbarrow. It has a job to do, and that is to deliver the worship of grateful hearts to the King of kings.

Worship music is beautiful, breathtaking, gorgeous to behold...It is clear from the Bible that music is integral to worship and the Psalms call for exuberant praise:

"Praise him with the sounding of the trumpet, praise him with the harp and lyre, praise him with tambourine and dancing, praise him with the strings and flute, praise him with the clash of cymbals, praise him with resounding cymbals"
(Psalms 150:3-5 NIV).

The object of worship – the Triune God of the Bible – is the most beautiful, most gracious, most magnificent Being in the universe; He deserves the most magnificent music possible. Such spectacular music can't help but stir the soul. Music moves us in powerful ways as melody and poetry come together to touch us intellectually and emotionally.

It's very appropriate then that worship leaders work to make music that is excellent and beautiful and breath-taking. God deserves it. We ought to practice and prepare so that we offer powerful music that enables people to think and feel and sing: *"God is good and His mercy endures forever"* (see 2 Chronicles 5:13).

So in one sense, worship music is indeed a beautiful work of art for our glorious God. But let's pause for a moment to consider the nature of art.

When people stand in front of a beautiful painting or sculpture and marvel at it, they are enjoying it for the sake of the artifact. An art lover enjoys Van Gogh's "Starry Night" for "Starry Night." You marvel at Tchaikovsky's "1812 Overture" for the sake of the "1812 Overture." You appreciate the art for the art.

Not so with worship music. We can appreciate the artistry of a worship song, but if we stop there, we are missing out – big time – on the even more beautiful, breathtaking God or gospel truth that that song communicates. A worship song can inspire awe but it should ultimately point not to itself but to God. The glory in "Starry Night" is found in that painting. The glory of a worship song is ultimately found in God.

But it's still a wheelbarrow. This is why the "beautiful wheelbarrow" metaphor is particularly helpful. It acknowledges that yes, worship music is rightly artistically beautiful. It also reminds us though that that artistic beauty is not its final goal. It has a job to do, namely, to carry the praises of God's people to the utterly beautiful, utterly breathtaking God who has saved us and made us His people.

Music is particularly well suited for this job – it allows a large group of people to join together to say things to God in a way that group readings never could. That convergence of melody and poetry allows us together to really powerfully respond to God for the grace He has shown to us. It is inherently participatory – we can do it together and actually enjoy doing it!

Here is where preparation becomes especially important. Yes, the song should be performed with excellence, but that's not all. If a song is to be enjoyed for the song, it doesn't matter what key it's in. If a worship song though is meant to carry the praises of the people (who really don't sing that often six days of the week), we need to make sure that the key and the rhythm are in fact singable for even non-musicians. The worship wheelbarrow has a job, and we need to make sure that it will be able to do that job.

As we think about worship music, "servant" language is appropriate: worship songs serve the greater purpose of enabling the congregation to glorify God. I hope that the "worship wheelbarrow" is a helpful image to you in thinking about the songs you use. They're like the most beautiful wheelbarrow that you've ever seen, but they're still wheelbarrows, intended to carry the praises of the people to the God who loves them deeply.

On Easter this year, we want to create an environment that screams, "We have been planning for your arrival and we are so glad you came!" This begins in the parking lots and travels to the doors and through the hallways of our building until a guest is seated in our worship service. **We want to give each guest a 5-star experience and communicate that they are important and the message of the gospel we celebrate is important.** This is where we need your help. We need more people to serve on the Host Team this Easter. Please join us for this one day as we seek to create a warm and welcoming environment.
