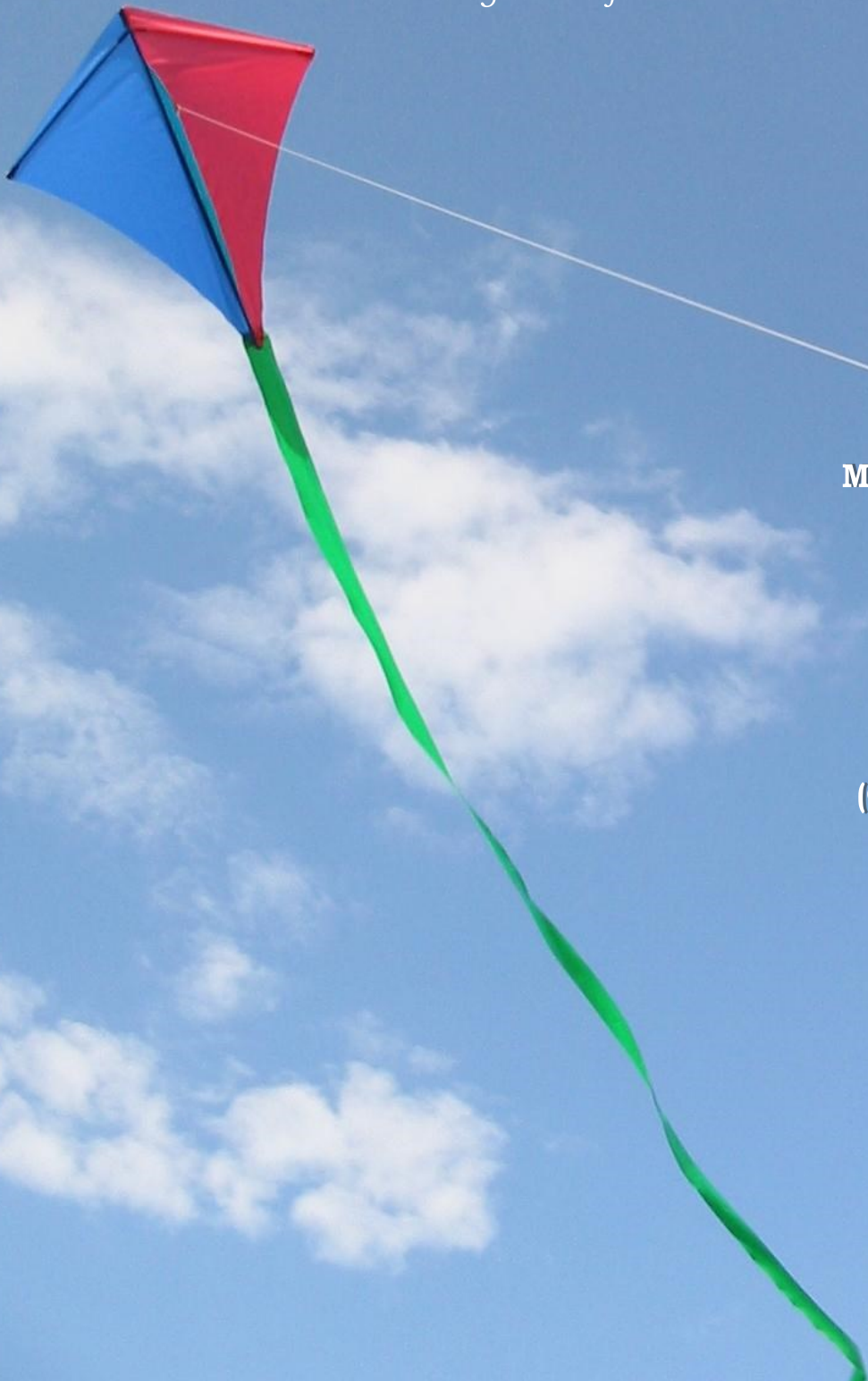

## **The 5 Personal Practices are:**

**E**ngage in the Great Commission

To make these practices practical and applicable, the following questions may help us as we seek to build these practices into our lives.

- How am I going to fill my mind with God's truth?
- How am I going to pray?
- How am I going to fast?
- How am I going to give of my resources for kingdom causes?

### **How will I find my Right Place of Service?**

- How am I currently serving?
- How will I go about finding my right place of service?
- Who does God want to touch through my life and ministry?

### **How will I prioritize Weekly Worship?**

- How will I worship personally?
- How will I prepare to give myself more completely to God in the context of corporate worship?

### **How will I Connect with others in a healthy small group?**

- Who am I connected to right now?
- What is my next step to get connected?
- Does God want me to be a leader of a small group?

### **How will I Engage in the Great Commission?**

- Who am I praying for that doesn't know Christ?
- Who does Christ want me to share the gospel with?
- How will I share Christ with those around me?
- How will I impact the nations? Praying? Giving? Going?
- Who will I pour my life into that will be able to pour their lives into the lives of others?

This month as we celebrate Easter and all that Christ has done for us, it is a good time to reflect on not only His grace toward us, but our growth in Christlikeness through His grace. *"But grow in the grace and knowledge of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. - \* **The Worship Choir:** sings most Sundays at the 8:15 worship service throughout the year and is a major part of Easter and Christmas worship celebrations. We have singers of all ages-youth through senior adults. Rehearsals are 7:30 p.m. on Wednesday nights.
- \* **Seasonal Singers:** sing at special presentations with the Worship Choir such as Easter and Christmas. Rehearsals are 8:15-9:00 p.m. on Wednesday nights. (If childcare is needed for worship choir practice, whether choir member or seasonal singer, you must let Diane Dulin know by 10:00 a.m. on Monday via email at [ddulin@fbcfm.com](mailto:ddulin@fbcfm.com) for the current week.)
- \* **The Handbell Choir:** meets on Wednesday evenings from 5:15-6:15 p.m. in the old choir room. You must be able to read music to participate in this group. The Handbell Choir performs at some of the 8:15 worship services, the Candlelight service and various community venues.
- \* **The Celebrator Choir:** meets on Mondays from 10:30-11:30 a.m. September through early May. This group enjoys singing at various community venues and also sings on Sunday mornings a few times a year. This group is comprised mostly of adults who have retired and enjoy singing.

## Easter Is Coming...

There are two times of the year when it is not only “ok” to be Christian, but it is expected that you can and will do something to celebrate — Christmas and Easter. This became more of a reality to me last year while we were still in India. The majority of people in that city of 11 million are Hindu, but there are more than one million Muslims, a good number of Catholics, and a sprinkling of several other religions. On our floor of the apartment complex were a Buddhist family, a Muslim family, three Hindu families and us. About a week or so before Easter a Hindu neighbor asked if we were going to do anything for the community to celebrate Easter. The Baptist hospital where I was a board member had a great sunrise service on the roof open for anyone to attend.

This is a place where Christian persecution is high, many national friends have faced terrible retribution for their faith. But on Easter there was acceptance and expectation. Easter is a real chance to get the message out that we are different and to be beacons of “light” in our communities. Increasingly, persecution of Christian beliefs and principles is on the rise right here in the US. It is no longer the “right” thing to do to be a Christian that talks about and demonstrates your faith. We are living in a very challenging time where we regularly see the fabric of our “Christian nation” being torn apart. I want to challenge us all to take advantage of the opportunity that celebrating Easter provides. We will have our regular service times on Easter Sunday, March 27, here at First Baptist. If you are in town, please invite friends and family to join you for corporate worship. I also want to do something different in our individual neighborhoods....

Consider getting with another family or two and hosting an Easter “Neighborhood Sunrise Celebration” at your home in the driveway, on the deck, at a clubhouse or just in the yard. You could even use your garage or living room if the weather is not conducive Easter morning. I have posted on the church website some suggestions for a celebration time. There are some graphics to download that you can use to make signs for your yard or flyers to give out to your neighbors. You can post a notice on your neighborhood Facebook page or on your community news site (like Nextdoor), if you have one. You can also just catch your neighbors when they are outside and invite them (avoid putting things in peoples’ mailboxes). Have them bring lawn chairs and/or blankets, invite the kids and celebrate together!

Sunrise will be right at 7:16 a.m., so begin at 7:00. Have some coffee/hot chocolate and snacks if you want, keep it simple and easy. There are some suggested songs and some possible music to use on the web link. Also, there is a short children’s lesson and activity, Scripture reading and a suggested Easter devotion by Henry Blackaby. Start and end with a prayer time including asking for prayer requests. You can plan on 20-30 minutes for everything. You can certainly do something different other than what I have posted, these are just suggestions. The important thing is to celebrate our risen Savior and proclaim your devotion to Him through this special holiday. If others join you, all the better!

All of us can do this, we don’t have to have some special “leadership” mantle, just be followers of the Risen One! If no one else shows up, you should still celebrate Jesus’ victory over death. Afterward, if you go to the early service, invite your neighbors to go with you. If you go to one of the other services, then invite neighbors to have breakfast together (everyone bring something or go somewhere), then invite them to come with you to the services.

## Critic, Consumer, or Participant

As I'm writing this, I'm still recovering from a stomach virus that swept through my family and several other church folks this week, including our lead pastor.

It's been about four years since illness last put me out of commission on a Saturday night and I had (thankfully, I guess) forgotten what it's like to do the Saturday scramble to get the fill-in worship leader and band all set up. But as I reflected at home while the church service went on without me, I was thankful for the reminder that God doesn't really need me to make worship happen—God builds and provides for His church with exactly the right people to serve when and where they're needed. Our human efforts can't compete with God's own care for His church, and yesterday my faithful friends and brothers and sisters in Christ covered preaching and music just fine.

Sometimes we need to fight the mindset in our churches that all is lost or wasted when our plans are derailed by illness, accident or other unexpected events. All is not wasted, and often God means to work greater good by derailing our plans. Over the years, I've seen three different mindsets revealed when our plans go kaput and these appear often in my own heart. See how often any of the following three have been true of your attitude toward the worship gathering.

### 1. The Critic

Often we show up to church with very staunch, grand ideas of how we expect to be led or "inspired" to worship God. Or we have grand ideas of how God will be most glorified in this time of corporate worship and are peeved on behalf of God when things go awry. The tendency is to cast a judgmental eye on the worship time, on the preacher, on the worship leader, on the reader of Scripture, or whoever, and see them as not doing their best. Or worse yet, we see the worship time as a waste and not pleasing to God because something went a little rough. The critical mindset often judges something that happened (or didn't happen smoothly) based on what they think someone else might be thinking (a visitor perhaps). Critiques are often founded on good, true things, but the critical mindset fails because it doesn't connect everything to the bigger picture of what God really does value and what He means to accomplish with a gathered church.

### 2. The Consumer

When I've seen a consumeristic mindset crop up, it's usually not quite as upset by anything that happens. But the evaluation of success from a worship consumer is usually based on the wrong things: preferences and feelings. In our humanness, we feel the best about things that appeal to our emotions in the right ways and when they make us feel comfortable. When we don't feel these ways, we often check out or don't feel invested. But preferences differ so much from one person to the next that they will never be fully satisfied for any group of people in any one church. Often the bigger problem with the consumer mindset is that a consumer doesn't see him/herself as a participant, but only as an observer, much like someone who has bought a ticket to a concert or a game, expecting to see something enjoyable. When we're not pleased, we start thinking of all the other places we'd rather be, where "the real fun" is happening.

### 3. The Participant

The "Participant" mindset is, I think, what we need to fight for. God never speaks of His gathered church in the New Testament as a group of critics or consumers, but as participants in the family of God. Every single person who shows up, if they are regenerate believers in Christ, have been given gifts by the Holy Spirit and are expected to use them, always, for edification. When we sing, we are commanded to sing together and "to one another" (Ephesians 5:19). We care for one another, suffer, and rejoice with one another (1 Corinthians 12:24-26). We are all, always, called to be participants. When every worshiper sees themselves as necessary to the gathering, that we're all in it together and that the gathering is much, much bigger than whoever is leading from the stage, everything changes. We find joy in the right things and can push through the rough and unexpected, because God is using us all to edify one another and help one another hold fast to Christ another week.

And this is why I was so encouraged yesterday and so thankful to be a part of a church where God takes us unexpected places sometimes—filling the gaps in good, gracious ways when our own plans, that seemed so wise, are derailed. Let's fight to be participants every week and to be thankful for how God provides leadership and gifting in the right people, at the right times, in the clutch ways that He sees fit.
