- Grew and developed as a man- Luke 2:40, 52
 - Intellectually "wisdom"
 - o Physically "stature"
 - Spiritually "favor with God"
 - Socially "favor with...man"
- He had the appearance of a man- John 4:9
- He had the limitations of man
 - o Fatique- John 4:6
 - Need of sleep- Matthew 8:24
 - Hunger- Matthew 21:18
 - o Thirst- John 19:28
 - Subject to pain- Luke 22:44
 - Capable of death- I Corinthians 15:3

Why did Jesus need to be fully human? (Adapted from Systematic Theology, Grudem)

- 2. To be a substitute sacrifice Hebrews 2:16-17
- 3. To fulfill the role of a mediator 1 Timothy 2:5
- 4. To fulfill God's Original Purpose for Man to rule over creation Genesis 1:26-30; Hebrews 2:8-9; Matthew 28:18; Revelation 3:21; Luke 19:17; 19; 1 Corinthians 6:3
- 5. To be our Example and Pattern 1 John 2:6

Jesus Christ is God

- Scripture expressly declares Him to be God -Luke 2:18; John 1:1-3; 5:18; John 8:57-59; 12:45; 14:9; 20:28; Romans 9:5; I Timothy 3:16; Titus 1:3, 4; Hebrews 1:8; 3:1-4
- Scripture affirms His divine attributes
 - He is Omniscient John 16:30; Colossians 2:3
 - o He is Omnipotent Revelation 1:8; Hebrews 1:3; Matthew 28:18
 - He is Omnipresent Matthew 18:20; 28:20; Ephesians 1:23
 - He is Eternal John 1:1, 15; 8:58; Hebrews 1:10-11
 - He is Immutable Hebrews 1:11-12; 13:8
- His divine offices show Him to be God
 - Creator John 1:3; Colossians 1:16
 - Preserver of all things Colossians 1:17; Hebrews 1:3
 - Forgiver of sins Mark 2:5-11

Why did Jesus need to be fully God?

Only God is sufficient to pay the full penalty for the sin of all mankind and provide the kind of righteousness that would make us completely acceptable to God. – 1 John 2:2; 2 Corinthians 5:21

Passage for Meditation – Philippians 2:5-11

5 Have this mind among yourselves, which is yours in Christ Jesus, 6 who, though he was in the form of God, did not count equality with God a thing to be grasped, 7 but emptied himself, by taking the form of a servant, being born in the likeness of men. 8 And being found in human form, he humbled himself by becoming obedient to the point of death, even death on a cross. 9 Therefore God has highly exalted him and bestowed on him the name that is above every name,10 so that at the name of Jesus every knee should bow, in heaven and on earth and under the earth, 11 and every tongue confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father.

Belief Statements: Concise statements of truth that are taken directly from the text.

Example: Jesus humbled himself in obedience to God the Father.

Application: Am I living in humble obedience to God the Father? Are there specific areas of pride and/or disobedience in my life?

Pray: Thank Jesus for His obedience in going to the cross to pay for your disobedience.
