### “Tale of Two Cities” (Acts 17:1-15)

What was the difference between Thessalonica and Berea?

#### 1. **They came to Thessalonica** (v.1-9).

- a. A Jewish synagogue was there (v.1).
- b. Paul went into the synagogue (v.2+3).
- c. Paul saw a mixed reaction (v.4-9).
  - i. Some were persuaded (v.4).
  - ii. The Jews became jealous (v.5-7).
- d. The city officials were upset (v.8+9).

#### 2. **They were sent to Berea** (v.10-14).

- a. Paul and Silas were sent to Berea (v.10).
- b. A comparison was made (v.11a). The people of Berea were of *more noble character than* those of Thessalonica. Why? The reason was given (v.11b).
  - i. They received the word.
  - ii. They examined the scriptures.
- c. Mixed results were reported (v.12+13).
  - i. Many in Berea believed (v.12).
  - ii. But the Jews found out (v.13).
- d. The church acted immediately (v.14).

#### 3. **Paul went on to Athens** (v.15).

Paul’s escorts brought him to Athens.
